J'khandgears up for civic polls

Ranchi, 29 October

After nearly three years of delay, the Jharkhand government is preparing to hold the long-pending Urban Local Body (ULB) elections. The move follows the Jharkhand High Court's firm stance on the prolonged absence of elected civic representatives across the state.

Officials indicated that the government may grant Cabinet approval for the polls before the next hearing on 10 November, clearing the way for the State Election Commission to issue a formal notification. District-level committees are finalising ward-wise reservation lists, which will be sent to the Commission once approved.

Jharkhand has 48 urban local body areas, including nine municipal corporations, 19 municipal councils and 20 nagar panchayats. This will be the first civic election since the implementation of the OBC "triple test" formula, which enables reservation for BC-1 and BC-2 categories. Based on the recommendations of the State Backward Class Commission, total reservation in urban bodies will not exceed 50 per cent, distributed among Scheduled Castes, Scheduled Tribes and OBC groups. The reservation of posts such as mayor and ward councillors will follow a rotational pattern.

For the past three years, these urban bodies have functioned without elected representatives, with administrative control resting solely with officials. The absence of local representatives has slowed urban governance, affecting essential services such as waste management, street lighting and water supply.

Political parties, sensing the approaching polls, have begun mobilising their cadres. The BJP has accused the government of "sleeping over" the issue until pulled up by the court. "The government ignored urban voters for years. Basic civic services have collapsed under bureaucratic control," said BJP leader Deendayal Banwal.

The ruling Congress, however, maintains that the delay was due to legal and procedural formalities. Party general secretary Rakesh Sinha said the government had shown "a positive approach" once the OBC triple test report and the appointment of the State Election Commissioner were finalised.

Meanwhile, Congress has launched its own review. State president Keshav Mahato Kamlesh has called meetings on October 30-31 at party HQ to assess preparations across all ULBs. "Even if polls aren't on a party basis, our committed workers will contest and uphold Congress values locally," Kamlesh said.

Shah predicts landslide victory for NDA in Bihar

Union Home Minister Amit Shah on Wednesday slammed the INDIA bloc for promoting dynastic politics and predicted that the NDA would sweep the upcoming Bihar Assembly polls. Addressing election rallies in Darbhanga and Samastipur, he sought to dispel confusion over the political future of Bihar Chief Minister Nitish Kumar.

"Lalu Prasad wants to make his son the chief minister and Sonia Gandhi wants to make her son the prime minister. Today, I tell both of them that neither the post of CM in Bihar nor the post of PM in Delhi is vacant. In Bihar, Nitish Kumar is the chief minister, and in Delhi, Narendra Modi is the Prime Minister," Shah said.

Addressing a rally in support of BJP candidate Maithili Thakur, Shah said: "We have given a ticket to 25-year-old Maithili Thakur despite her having no political background. Could that happen in Congress or RJD?"

He said under the leadership of Prime Minister Narendra Modi and Chief Minister Nitish Kumar, Bihar has achieved new heights in development



and good governance and is moving rapidly toward becoming a fully developed state. "Building bridges over Bihar's rivers, controlling the floods of the Kosi, channeling floodwater into farmers' fields, and respecting every poor person, these are a few important tasks that Narendra Modi and Nitish Kumar have carried out," he added.

Shah highlighted various welfare initiatives of the state government, including a Rs 10,000 transfer to over one crore women, 125 units of

free electricity per household, and an increase in social security pensions.

He also mentioned the Central government's flagship schemes, such as health insurance of up to Rs 5 lakh for the poor, annual assistance of Rs 6,000 to farmers, and free ration to over 8.52 crore beneficiaries in Bihar.

The BJP leader accused the Congress and its allies of obstructing the construction of the Ram Temple in Ayodhya. "We built the magnificent Ram Lalla temple in Ayodhya.

Now, we will build the Maa Janaki Temple in Sitamarhi at a cost of over Rs 882 crore," he said. Launching a scathing attack on the Congress, RJD, and other Opposition parties for allegedly ignoring terrorist attacks in the past, Shah said that Prime Minister Modi had established a new tradition of giving terrorists a strong and decisive response.

He further said that the NDA government permanently abrogated Article 370, banned the PFI, and put its entire cadre behind bars.

Rahul, Tejashwi term Nitish as puppet

Leader of the Opposition in the Lok Sabha, Rahul Gandhi, launched his campaign for the 2025 Bihar Assembly elections on Wednesday with a call tooust the Nitish Kumar-led Bihar government, which he alleged is "remote-controlled by PM Modi and Home Minister Amit Shah". He urged the youth of Bihar to elect an INDIA bloc government that would fulfill their aspirations for government jobs and industrial revival in the state. Addressing a rally in Sakra, Muzaffarpur, in support of Congress candidate Umesh Ram, Rahul Gandhi outlined his vision to transform Bihar into a developed state by promoting entrepreneurship.

In a sharp attack on PM Modi,

the Congress leader said that the PM had destroyed small-scale industries through schemes such as demonetisation and GST, only to benefit industrialists like Ambani and Adani.

He said: "Ambani or Adani will not bring development to Bihar. Bihar will be developed only by its youth. You have built Delhi, Mumbai, and Dubai. Now you need to build Bihar. Start with small-scale manufacturing units and replace 'Made in China' products with those 'Made in Bihar'." Rahul launched a sharp attack on Bihar's examination system and corruption, saying that no matter how hard the youth of Bihar work, when exam papers are leaked in advance to the rich and well-connected, the honest and hardworking youngsters are deprived of their rightful opportunities.

India's ports to attract Rs 8 trillion by 2047: Puri

Union Minister Hardeep Singh Puri on Wednesday said that the oceans are not barriers, but the bridges to a better future, and the country is modernizing ports, and taking initiatives for building an inclusive and future ready maritime economy.

He said that the country is ready to work with global partners to make the maritime sector a strong driver of a developed and self-reliant India.

Speaking at the India Maritime Week on Wednesday, Puri said that the maritime sector is poised to attract Rs 8 trillion of investment and also going to create 1.5 crore new jobs by the year 2047.

According to Puri, the country is playing a key role in shaping global trade routes through initiatives like the India-Middle East-Europe Economic Corridor and the International North-South Transport Corridor, linking Indian ports with Europe, Central Asia, and Africa.

The Minister said that the country's economy is growing



fast, with the GDP now around 4.3 trillion dollars.

He said that nearly half of this comes from the external sector, which includes exports, imports, and remittances showing how important trade, and therefore shipping is for the country's economic progress.

He said that under Prime Minister Narendra Modi's leadership, the country's maritime sector has seen major changes over the past eleven years.

According to Puri, the port capacity has increased from 872 million metric tons per

annum in 2014 to 1,681 million metric tons in the present day, while cargo volumes have gone up from 581 million tons to about 855 million tons.

The minister said that efficiency has also improved with turnaround time reduced by 48 per cent and idle time cut by 29 per cent.

Throwing light on the Sagarmala Programme, he said it has already mobilised projects worth over Rs 5.5 lakh crore to modernise ports and connect coastal regions.

Puri said that country's

shipyards like the Cochin Shipyard, Mazagon Dock, GRSE Kolkata, HSL Visakhapatnam, and private yards in Goa and Gujarat are now building world-class vessels, and with partnerships like Cochin Shipyard with L&T and Daewoo for LNG and ethane carriers, and collaborations with Mitsui OSK Lines, are helping bring global technology into the country. He also mentioned that presently, 12 per cent of the world's seafarers are from India, which reflects unmatched maritime human-capital strength.

Two doctors booked for molesting nurse, probe underway:

Gwalior: Two senior doctors associated with JAY Arogya Super Speciality Hospital in Gwalior have been booked for alleged "molestation" of the nursing staff. An FIR has been registered against two senior doctors, including Superintendent of hospital Dr Girjashankar Gupta and Dr Shivam Yadav, HoD of Nephrology Department, a senior police official said. Action following a complaint of a 27-year-old nursing staff member and the resident of Gwalior in a written complaint alleged that senior doctors (name mentioned above) allegedly molested her on the pretext of job security. The woman, who is working as nursing staff on contract, told police that she had gone to Dr Shivam Yadav's chamber in the hospital to get her application marked and to receive the acknowledgement. The woman told police that when she entered the chamber, "Dr Shivam said if you want to get your job secured, you must compromise for sexual favour. Otherwise, I will transfer you somewhere and you won't be able to work."
