UAE intercepts incoming Iranian drone

An Iranian drone was intercepted early on Monday over United Arab Emirates territorial waters, the Defence Ministry said. The attack followed an exchange of fire between Iran and the United States on the weekend, which was the first significant military action in the war for more than a month.

Iran fired a drone at the United Arab Emirates on Monday, which the UAE's Defence Ministry said was intercepted over its territorial waters. After more than a month with no significant fighting, the US attacked rocket launchers on an Iranian island on Sunday, saying they were preparing to launch missiles into the Strait of Hormuz.

Iran responded by launching missiles at US sites in Jordan, all of which were intercepted. Iran's President Masoud Pezeshkian said that his country was not seeking war, but that "we will respond decisively to aggressors. The UAE called the attack a "dangerous escalation" from Iran. During the



lull in fighting, the US has been ratcheting up economic pressure on Iran with the hope of forcing concessions out of Tehran, including reopening the vital Strait of Hormuz to shipping. Lebanon's Joseph Aoun is asking for Greece's help in implementing an agreement to end the war with Israel.

During meetings on Monday in Athens, Aoun told

Greek President Constantine Tassoulas and Prime Minister Kyriakos Mitsotakis that Lebanon has been through long wars and "its people are tired." He suggested that Greece has good relations with both Lebanon and Israel and could help facilitate an end to decades of war.

In comments aired by local TV stations, Aoun referred to the US-brokered

framework agreement between Lebanon and Israel that was signed in late June, saying "we ask Greece to do all it can to help Lebanon in implementing the agreement." In an apparent reference to daily Israeli airstrikes and shelling despite a June 20, Israel-Hezbollah ceasefire, Aoun said that "trying to solve the problem through military force will not

succeed." He said that the agreement "should not be implemented by one side but both sides." Mitsotakis told Aoun that "the security of Lebanon and Israel are not conflicting goals."

"Greece, as a traditional friend of both Lebanon and the Arab world, but also a strategic partner of Israel, stands ready to support every effort toward de-escalation and mutual understanding," he said. American aircraft carrier heading toward Thailand for port call after lengthy deployment The US aircraft carrier USS Abraham Lincoln is nearing Thailand, where it is expected to make a port visit after its lengthy deployment to the West Asia.

The carrier with some 5,000 sailors and its accompanying battle group was sailing Monday toward the Gulf of Thailand where it was expected to make a port call near the city of Pattaya.

The Lincoln, one of the US Navy's largest warships, was supporting the US war against Iran. Its deployment included a record-setting uninterrupted time at sea of more than 250 days.

Israel signs multi-billion-dollar weapons deal with Greece

Israel signed a multi-billion-dollar weapons deal with Greece, the largest between the two Mediterranean countries, as Israeli defence exports soar.

Israel's Defence Ministry said Monday the nearly 3 billion Euro (\$3.5 billion) defence export deal, coined Achilles Shield, is one of the country's largest and includes a multilayered air defence system for Greece using Israeli technology.

"Israel and Greece share common strategic interests and face shared regional challenges. At a time when actors with hegemonic ambitions are seeking to expand their influence and undermine stability in the region," said Defence Minister Israel Katz. The agreement comes as Israeli weapons exports have reached record highs with more than \$19 billion last year, a 30 per cent increase from 2024, according to official data, despite widespread criticism of Israel's conduct in its wars in

Gaza, with Hezbollah and with Iran. Experts say Governments look to Israel because its weapons are battle-tested and they're able to see in real time that the munitions and systems work.

Israel and Greece have deepened defence ties in the last decade. Monday's signing, however, marks the most significant deal between the two as Greece focuses on modernising its armed forces to keep pace with its neighbour and fellow NATO member Turkey amid long-standing disputes over sea boundaries in the eastern Mediterranean. Previous deals have included a \$1.65 billion agreement with Israeli defence contractor

Elbit to build a flight training school in southern Greece as well as the planned sale of Israeli rocket launchers, anti-tank guided missiles and drones.

Israel says Monday's agreement is the first time it will provide a complete array of defence weapons against a range of threats from ballistic missiles to drones.

It includes multiple Israeli systems such as David Sling and SPYDER as well as a new national command and control system. In addition to the agreement, a complementary deal valued at \$30 million (26 million Euros) was signed for the sale of Rafael's Drone Dome systems, it said. (AP)

Nepalese teacher evacuates school in Trishuli Valley just ahead of raging flash flood

Rajendra Dawadi was inside his classroom when the school's accountant rushed in with a warning: Floodwaters were racing through Nepal's Trishuli Valley, tearing apart homes, bridges and entire villages.

Then a teacher received another warning by phone. Moments later, a parent arrived to take her child home. The danger had not yet been confirmed, but Dawadi had little time to act. He rang the school bell and ordered his students and staff out of the building and toward higher ground.

"I immediately decided to stop... school and (get the children out)," he said. As he followed them to a nearby hill, the floodwaters rose behind him. From the safety of the hillside, he turned to watch the school where he had once been a student — and where he had spent years teaching — disappear beneath a torrent of water, mud, boulders and debris. Two staff members could not make it and remain missing.

Dawadi's decision to evacuate the school saved at least 900 students from last week's devastating flash floods in Nepal, unleashed after a



glacial collapse in the Himalayas. The disaster killed over 900 people across Nepal and China, while more than 4,700 remain missing. As Nepal grapples with the catastrophic natural disaster, Dawadi's story has emerged as a striking example of foresight and courage.

The Tribhuvan Trishuli Secondary School in the Trishuli Valley of north-central Nepal had 1,643 students. At least 900 were on campus that morning, while some students were still making their way to

school. Dawadi ordered those already there to leave and called bus drivers, telling them to only stop at safer places.

One bus, packed with students, had already reached the school when Dawadi told the driver to turn back, he said. The bus crossed a newly constructed bridge and, moments later, the old bridge beside it collapsed. For Dawadi, the scale of the destruction has become personal, as the school had been both his workplace and a large part of his life. (AP)

We will die here: Nepal flood survivors recount desperate escapes as search for missing continues

Badri Prasad Devkota saw a wall of muddy water rushing towards the bus carrying him, his wife and 34 other pilgrims to the Hindu holy site of Gosainkunda in Nepal's Rasuwa district.

"My wife grabbed my hand and pleaded, 'Do not jump.' I told her, 'We will die here,'" Devkota told The Kathmandu Post. He broke free from her grip and jumped from the moving bus as the Bhotekoshi flood swept across the road at Bhainse in Nuwakot.

The wave knocked him into a roadside drain, but he clung to vegetation on the hillside. From there, he watched the bus disappear beneath the floodwaters. The newspaper reported on Monday that two bodies had been recovered.

ered and 28 people remained missing from the group — one of them is Devkota's wife.

The August 26 floods have left survivors facing the task of rebuilding their lives while thousands of families continue searching for missing loved ones. With hundreds dead and thousands still missing,

accounts from those who escaped offer a glimpse of the suddenness and scale of the disaster.

After the flood subsided, Devkota and his cousin Tularam, who was among six passengers who survived by jumping from the bus, climbed about 20 metres up the hillside and spent two hours on a patch

Russian drone strikes on warehouses trigger Kyiv food shortages

Russian forces relentlessly battered Kyiv and cities in the region around the Ukrainian Capital for a fifth straight day Monday, leaving some supermarket shelves bare after repeated strikes on warehouses as Ukraine reels from attacks with jet-powered drones.

Russia has intensified its aerial attacks in recent months, more than four years after it invaded its neighbor. Almost constant air raid alerts in the Kyiv region in recent days have severely disrupted daily routines.



Two major attacks in July killed almost 50 civilians, and a strike on Saturday killed at least 38 people. Classes were due to resume at Ukrainian schools on Tuesday, but it

of grass. They saw people stranded on rooftops and others buried in mud before climbing higher to a village named Hilekharka, where local residents offered them tea and biscuits and helped them obtain first aid.

The two returned to the Bhainse area the following day searching for their families, but found no trace of them before travelling back to their home district, Gorkha.

At Betrawati, Santaman Lama survived by heeding a warning, but lost almost everything he owned.

Lama told Onlinekhabar news portal on Sunday that he had taken his son and daughter to school on the morning of August 26 and was returning home when a nearby hardware-shop owner warned him that a flood was coming and told him to move uphill.

It was unclear whether parents would send their children. Schools have air raid shelters, and classes can also be held online. "Right now, Russia's tactic is to wear down Ukraine and Ukrainians - first and foremost, our people," Ukrainian President Volodymyr Zelenskyy said on social media late Sunday.

Ukraine has also tried to make Russian civilians feel the burden of war by hammering major online retailers and oil facilities. The attacks have brought shortages for ordinary Russians, though its strikes have not been as deadly for civilians. (AP)

China arrests military trade executive for spying for two nations

A Chinese military trading company executive has been arrested for allegedly leaking sensitive defence information to intelligence agencies from two countries, China's top spy and anti-espionage agency said on Monday.

Public disclosures involving a Chinese national recruited simultaneously by multiple separate foreign intelligence agencies are extremely rare, the Hong Kong-based South China Morning Post reported.

Espionage, especially relating to military secrets in China, attracts the death penalty. The Ministry of State Security on Monday outlined the case of the suspect, identified only by his surname Zhang, in an article published on an official social media account.

The report did not name the two foreign countries involved, referring to them only as "Country A" and "Country B". It also did not name the Chinese company or provide an exact timeline for the case. According to the ministry, Zhang was fluent in an unknown number of foreign languages after years of studying abroad. (PTI)
