# Eight Oppn leaders barred from LS for 'unruly behaviour'

After eight Opposition members were suspended from the Lok Sabha for the rest of the Budget session for "unruly behaviour" on Tuesday, sources in the Opposition said their MPs would continue to raise the issue of unpublished "memoirs" of former Army chief General M M Naravane for the remainder of the session.

Prime Minister Narendra Modi is scheduled to reply to the discussion on the motion of thanks to President Droupadi Murmu's address on Wednesday.

On Tuesday, as the Lok Sabha resumed the discussion on the motion of thanks to the President's address, Leader of the Opposition Rahul Gandhi rose to speak and authenticated a copy of an article which cited former army chief Naravane's unpublished 'memoir'. To authenticate a document, a member has to submit a signed copy of it affirming that it is correct to the best of his knowledge.

Krishna Prasad Tenneti, who was chairing the House, asked Gandhi to table it and said: "We will examine it and get back." Parliamentary Affairs Minister Kiren Rijiju said the Speaker passed a ruling on the matter and after that Gandhi should not raise the issue. Gandhi insisted he is the Leader of Opposition and takes objection to the term 'permission' when he has to speak.

The chair then called out the names of other speakers even as Gandhi kept standing. While three Opposition MPs

refused to speak in solidarity with Gandhi, Harish Balayogi of the Telugu Desam Party, a constituent of the Bharatiya Janata Party-led National Democratic Alliance, got up to speak. This had Congress and other Opposition MPs enter the well of the House, some of whom tried to climb on to the table of the Secretary General, tore papers and threw them at the Chair. Tenneti adjourned the proceedings till 3 pm.

As soon as the House met at 3 pm following multiple adjournments, Dilip Saikia, who was in the Chair, named the eight MPs, including seven from Congress and one from Communist Party of India (Marxist) (CPI-M). Kiren Rijiju read out a resolution seeking suspension of the eight members for the remaining period of the Budget session, which concludes on April 2. Rijiju said the members acted in utter disregard to the House and the authority of the Chair. They also tore papers and threw these on the Chair and were named by the Chair for their behaviour, the minister

added. The suspended members are Gurjeet Singh Aujla, Hibi Eden, C Kiran Kumar Reddy, Amarinder Singh Raja Warring, Manickam Tagore, Prashant Padole and Dean Kuriakose (all Congress) and S Venkatesan (CPI-M).

The House passed the resolution by a voice vote, following which the proceedings were adjourned for the day amid uproar. Congress members, led by Rahul Gandhi, staged a protest outside Parliament building against the suspension of party members. Later, Opposition MPs said the suspended members will continue to protest outside the House. Tenneti, who was in the Chair earlier during the day, told the media that one member addressed the Chair as *yaar* and at that moment he took a stand and questioned the MP.

Later, in a letter to Lok Sabha Speaker Om Birla, Gandhi lodged his strong protest for disallowing him to speak in the House on a matter of national security and termed it a "blot" on our democracy.

## BJP's Khemchand to be Manipur CM

### Woman Kuki leader to be deputy CM

Y Khemchand Singh was elected the leader of the BJP legislature party in Manipur on Tuesday, paving the way for the formation of a popular government in the state with him as chief minister (CM).

Nemcha Kipgen, a woman Kuki leader and former minister, is likely to be the deputy CM in the new Manipur government when it is formed.

A meeting of the legislators of all constituents of the NDA was scheduled to be held on Tuesday night, where Singh and Kipgen's names are likely to be endorsed. Singh was elected as leader of the Manipur legislature party at a meeting of BJP MLAs held at

the party headquarters.

Except for two BJP MLAs, who are unwell, all other party legislators attended the meeting. Former chief minister N Biren Singh, Assembly speaker Satyabrata Singh, BJP state president A Sharda Devi, the party's central observer Tarun Chugh and its northeast in-charge Sambit Patra, among others, were also present.

The legislature party meet was held days ahead of the expiry of the second spell of the President's rule on February 12. Manipur has been under President's rule since February 13, 2025. The 60-member Assembly, which has tenure till 2027, was put on suspended animation after President's rule was imposed.

Currently, there are 37 BJP MLAs in Manipur. Initially, 32 BJP candidates had won the 2022 assembly elections. The JD(U) had won six seats, and five of its MLAs later defected to the BJP.

Among others, six are from the National People's Party (NPP), five from the Naga People's Front (NPF), five from the Congress, two from the Kuki People's Alliance, one from Janata Dal (United) and three Independents. One seat is vacant following the death of a sitting MLA.

## Will support motion for CEC impeachment: Bengal CM

West Bengal Chief Minister Mamata Banerjee on Tuesday said she and Trinamool Congress's (TMC) Members of Parliament would support any motion that a united Opposition, led by the Congress, brings for the removal of India's Chief Election Commissioner (CEC). She said that while neither her party nor a united Opposition has the requisite numbers in Parliament to ensure the passage of such a motion, the effort would be to put it on record.

Banerjee on Tuesday evening addressed a press conference in the national capital, where she alleged that victims of the special intensive revision (SIR) of electoral rolls were not being given an opportunity to defend themselves. She also questioned the intent behind conducting the



SIR in states ruled by Opposition parties, and not in Assam, where the BJP is in power, just ahead of assembly elections in some of these states.

Banerjee travelled to the national capital with "victims" from Bengal of the SIR process, who sat behind her as she addressed the media. On Monday, Banerjee and other leaders of her party, the Trinamool Congress, had taken some of these people to a meeting with CEC Gyanesh Kumar over the SIR issue.

## FTP Para 4.14 vs Para 2 of 22/2023-Customs, mismatch lands importer in trouble

We have obtained an advance authorisation for intermediate supplies under Para 4.05(c) (ii) of the FTP. At the time of imports, Customs say that one of our inputs attracts anti-dumping duty that is not eligible for exemption. We are taken by surprise because para 4.14 of the FTP denies exemption from anti-dumping duty only for imports for supplies covered under paragraph 7.02

(c) & (f) of the FTP. Our supply is covered under Para 7.02(a) of the FTP. Please clarify the correct position.

■ I guess your advance authorisation allows imports under notification no. 22/2023-Cus dated 1st April 2023. Para 2 of that notification says that the exemption from safeguard duty, transitional product specific safeguard duty, countervailing duty and antidumping duty shall not be available in respect of material required for final goods which are covered under sub-clauses (a), (c), (d) and (i) of clause (III) of the Explanation to this notification. The sub-clause (a) covers supply of goods against advance authorization or advance authorization for annual requirement or duty free import authorization scheme. Thus, the provisions

under the FTP and Customs notification are not aligned and Customs cannot be faulted for asking you to pay the anti-dumping duty. You could have averted this problem by asking for endorsement of notification 21/2023-Cus dated 1st April 2023 which allows exemption of anti-dumping duty and discharge of export obligation by advance intermediate authorization holder by supplying the resultant products to exporter in terms of paragraph 4.05(c) (iii) of FTP.

We refer to the DGFT notification no. 56/2025-26 dated 29th January 2026, prescribing minimum import prices (MIP) for import of Penicillin-G-potassium (Pen-G) and its salts, 6-APA and Amoxicillin and its salts. It

says that the MIP condition will not apply for imports by EOU units in the SEZ and under the advance authorisation scheme subject to the condition that the imported inputs are not sold in domestic tariff area (DTA). Can we import these items below the MIP under advance authorisation for deemed exports?

■ Yes. The restriction is only in respect of sale of imported inputs into the DTA and not in respect of sale of goods manufactured using the imported inputs. So, you can import the items mentioned in the notification below the stipulated MIP under advance authorisation for deemed exports, use such items for manufacturing the final products and supply the final products as deemed exports to

discharge the export obligation.

We have imported certain goods for jobbing under the notification 32/97-Cus dated 1st April 1997. Can we use some indigenous material also for carrying out the jobbing process?

■ The CBEC Circular no. 18/2004-Cus dated 20th February 2004 clarifies that use of indigenous materials in jobbing work will not take the processes undertaken out of 'job-work' or jobbing. The definition of jobbing may be derived from the scope of the term "job work" clarified by Hon'ble Supreme Court in para 17 of their judgment in the case of Prestige Engineering (India) Ltd. v. CCE, Meerut [1994 (73) E.L.T. 497 (S.C.)].
