The meeting of the Board of Directors of the Company commenced at 12:15 P.M. and concluded at 1.40 P.M. on 28th April, 2025.

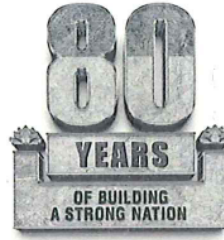

Independent Auditor's Report

To the Board of Directors of Shree Digvijay Cement Company Limited Report on the audit of the Standalone Annual Financial Results

Opinion

We have audited the accompanying standalone annual financial results of Shree Digvijay Cement Company Limited (hereinafter referred to as the "Company") for the year ended 31 March 2025, attached herewith, being submitted by the Company pursuant to the requirement of Regulation 33 of the Securities and Exchange Board of India (Listing Obligations and Disclosure Requirements) Regulations, 2015, as amended ("Listing Regulations").

In our opinion and to the best of our information and according to the explanations given to us, the aforesaid standalone annual financial results:

- a. are presented in accordance with the requirements of Regulation 33 of the Listing Regulations in this regard; and

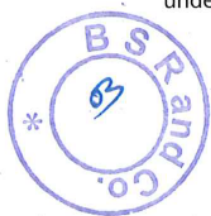

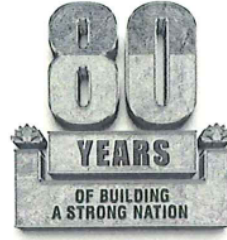
