# The land belongs to our fathers, we will give our lives but not the land

Today is a heavy day, there is a lot of movement in Gandhinagar; What is the Sagbara-Umarpada forest land dispute?

Sagbara, Narmada (Rajpipla)

The dispute over forest land between tribal farmers of Sagbara in Narmada district and Umarpada taluka in Surat district has been ongoing for the last 19 days. Farmers from around 12 villages including Halgam, Padi, Dodhanwadi, Khopi, Nal, which are near the Sagbara border, are fasting and protesting demanding permission to cultivate forest land in Umarpada. On the other hand, forest department officials and farmers of Umarpada are preventing the farmers of Sagbara from cultivating.

The farmers of Sagbara have been on a fast since August 8 over this issue. Along with these farmers, Bharuch MP Mansukh Vasava and Nandod MLA Darshanaben Dekhmukh observed a symbolic fast. Apart from this, Congress and Aam Aadmi Party leaders have expressed support for the farmers of Sagbara. After the representations of the MP and MLA to the government, this matter has reached Gandhinagar. The farmers protesting in Sagbara have announced to plough the land with a bang, in such a situation, today is going to be a heavy day. Divya Bhaskar interacted with the farmers at the site of the protest.

What is the whole matter? There has been a long-standing dispute between the tribals of Sagbara taluka of Narmada district and the local tribals of Umarpada taluka of Surat district regarding the cultivation and possession of forest land. The Ukai Dam affected farmers of about 12 villages of Sagbara taluka were allotted land for cultivation in Umarpada. For the last 20 years, the farmers of Sagbara had been

cultivating on the land they got in Umarpada. But for the last 2 years, there has been a conflict between the farmers of Sagbara and Umarpada over the cultivation of forest land. Along with this, the forest department officials are also demanding a resolution from the Gram Sabha and preventing the farmers of Sagbara from cultivating. Due to this, about 300 farmers of Sagbara have been on a fast in the Haripura Round Forest area of ??the Vadpada Range of Umarpada taluka for the last 18 days.

Protest of Umarpada farmers

On the other hand, the farmers of Umarpada taluka have a different side. They say that people from Sagbara taluka come to their area and plough the land. After the brutal murder of a 12-year-old girl in Vadpada village of Umarpada, the protest of local Umarpada farmers has become more fierce. They say that after this incident, they will not allow Sagbara farmers to plough the land in this area.

Forest Department is working as per law: ACF Gaurang Lodhi On August 10, ACF Gaurang Lodhi of Surat Forest Department said that under the Forest Rights Act 2006, those who have tilled their land before 13-12-2005 and have been cultivating it for years will get claims from the Revenue Department and Forest Department. The Forest Department's resolution has made it clear that the resolution of the village Gram Sabha of the village in which the land is located is necessary for cultivation. In this case, this land falls in Umarpada and the farmers of Sagbara are making the claim. The Gram Sabha resolutions that the

farmers have submitted to Sagbara are also wrong.

We will give our lives but not give our land: Leelaben Vasava

Farmers of Sagbara have been on a fast for the last 19 days. Farmer leader and former BJP leader Leelaben Vasava said that we thought that the government would take some positive decision. Farmers of Sagbara come every day and ask whether any decision has been taken or not. I want to tell the forest department officials that this land is ours, our father's. We will give our lives but not give our land. On August 27, farmers of Sagbara will come with farming tools like ploughs and start ploughing here.

Two state ministers will visit farmers in Sagbara: Mansukh Vasava

Bharuch-Narmada MP Mansukh Vasava had earlier met Chief Minister Bhupendra Patel regarding this entire matter. Yesterday, on August 26, a meeting was held in Gandhinagar with Deputy Chief Minister Harsh Sanghvi, Forest Minister Arjun Modhwadia, Tribal Minister Naresh Patel and former Minister Ganpat Vasava, Bharuch-Narmada MP Mansukh Vasava and forest department officials. After the meeting, MP Mansukh Vasava said that an important decision has been taken in the meeting regarding this forest land dispute. After Raksha Bandhan, State Forest Minister Pravin Mali and in-charge Minister Ishwar Singh Patel will go to Sagbara along with officials to discuss with the agitating farmers. The government has decided to give land to the farmers on the basis of evidence. There will also be a discussion on the 80 thousand claims pending till now.

## Drought-like situation in many areas due to El Nino effect

Approximately 20-25 days left before monsoon departs, September rains are expected

With about 20 to 25 days left before the monsoon season ends, the lack of rainfall has increased the concerns of farmers. Although 65 days of the season have passed, there is still a 3 to 87 percent rainfall deficit in 17 districts. The worst condition is in Devbhoomi Dwarka, Jamnagar, Porbandar and Kutch. Now everyone is focused on the September rains. If the rains remain low in September, it is likely to have a direct impact on kharif crops (cotton, soybean, corn and pulses). Apart from this, if there is not enough moisture in the soil, the sowing and production of crops like wheat and mustard in the upcoming Rabi season may also be affected.

According to the weatherman, the monsoon officially departs from Gujarat in late September or early October. Light to moderate rains are likely to occur in some parts of the state for the next seven days. Light rains are likely, especially in the coastal areas of South Gujarat and Saurashtra. There is no major possibility of heavy rains at present.

Saurashtra has 30% rainfall, while the state has 7% rainfall.

There has been no significant change in temperature in Ahmedabad and Gandhinagar amid the rainy weather. The temperature in Ahmedabad and Gandhinagar has been recorded around 33 degrees Celsius. There is a possibility of light rain in both the cities in the coming days amid heat and humidity. So far, Gujarat has recorded 7% rainfall deficit. However, Gujarat region has recorded 9% more rainfall than normal. The situation in Saurashtra is worrying and about 30%

## 'If you don't eat fish, name it Narendra Modi Fish Market'

Liquor shops should be closed during Ramzan; Owaisi's entry in the controversy over the name of the fish market in Surat

'These people refuse to eat fish and when a fish market is built at a cost of crores of rupees, it is named Narendra Modi Fish Market, they came to catch us by setting a target (fish catch figure) and got caught themselves.' These are the words of AIMIM chief and Lok Sabha MP from Hyderabad Asaduddin Owaisi.

The fish market built by the Municipal Corporation at a cost of ₹3.90 crore in Nanpura-Lakkadkot, Surat, was named 'Shri Narendra Modi Wholesale Fish Market' on August 24 without any resolution. However, later, as the controversy escalated, this name was covered with a white cover on August 25 in the presence of the Municipal Corporation employees. Now, Asaduddin Owaisi has taken a

dig at the state and central governments on this issue from a meeting in Hyderabad.

Owaisi took a jibe at the name 'Narendra Modi Fish Market' and said, 'Look at the play of nature, the Modi government gave ₹3 crore in Surat and the Gujarat government gave ₹3 crore. Thus, a fish market was built under the Pradhan Mantri Matsya Yojana at a cost of ₹6 crore. This is not a laughing matter, it is true that the market owners named it 'Narendra Modi Fish Market'. He further alleged that on the one hand, people are being stopped on the issue of food and drink and on the other hand, the fish market is being named after PM Modi.'

The project, which was delayed since 2018, suddenly

found itself in controversy. The history of this fish market is also in controversy. In the official budget documents of the Municipal Corporation, this project was mentioned as 'Construction of fish market at Lakkadkot near Nanpura in Central Zone'. After the work started in the year 2018, the construction was stopped in 2020 due to objections from the National Monument Authority. After that, after obtaining a revised NOC, the market was ready with facilities including cold storage.

Raising questions on beef export,

Owaisi said about people's food choices, 'Hey, I eat fish, I eat meat, if someone eats pork, no one eats it, what's your problem, brother? You don't eat it, why shouldn't I?' Along with this, he attacked the export policy and said that India is exporting the most beef in the world and a lot of dollars are coming in, if there is a ban on eating meat and fish, then beef export should also be stopped.

At the end of the speech, Owaisi mentioned the holy month of Ramadan and demanded the government to close liquor shops. He sarcastically said, 'If you are banning meat and mutton, then keep us ashamed for 30 days of Ramadan. Close all shops where liquor is sold for 30 days. If the entire 30 days are not possible, then close them for at least the last 10 days of Ramadan, even if you have to start again.'

## '43 Gujaratis left' led to a terrible tragedy in Nepal

Kutch tour operator said - 'If it had been a little late, we would have also been victims', tourists reached China with tears in their eyes

The death toll from the landslide and subsequent floods in Nepal has been confirmed at 210 by the afternoon of August 27. A search is underway for 1,500 tourists, including 300 Indians, who are missing.

43 Gujarati tourists, including 25 NRIs, were miraculously rescued in this terrible accident. Disaster struck within hours of the tourists leaving the immigration center in Nepal. Kutch tour operator Shailesh Maheshwari, while talking to Bhaskar, said - If we had been a little late, we too would have been victims.

An NRI couple who had gone to Nepal from Anand has also gone missing after the tragedy. A group from Rajkot was also supposed to go on a pilgrimage to Kailash Mansarovar and was planning to stop at the place where the disaster occurred on August 26. But the Chinese government had to cancel the trip as it did not issue permits. These tourists are now convinced that they have survived.

32 Gujaratis who had left Nepal before the disaster also returned to Vadodara. They said that the scene of the collapse at the very place where we took the picture was horrifying. It was sad to know that the people who helped us during the journey also lost their lives.

Everything was destroyed where we were staying - Shailesh Maheshwari

Kutch tour operator Shailesh Maheshwari is on a pilgrimage to Kailash Mansarovar with 43 tourists, including 25 NRIs. All the tourists reached the immigration center in Nepal on August 26 and left for their onward journey within hours when the disaster struck and the place where they were staying suffered terrible

damage.

Shailesh Maheshwari, who has reached China, spoke to 'Bhaskar'.

Shailesh Maheshwari said, "When we were there, we never thought that such an incident would happen. The weather was good at that time and the weather there is good even now. The reason why such a big tragedy happened is not known."

The Friendship Bridge, Nepal's immigration center, market and several surrounding villages were completely destroyed. According to locals, about 500 people were present at the immigration center at the time of the accident. In addition to those who came for immigration, there were also Nepali support staff there.

Shailesh Maheshwari further said that he got the visa at around 9.30 pm. One of his friends took a 4 am flight from Delhi and reached Kathmandu at 6 am. A helicopter was arranged for him and he reached him at 10 am. After that, the convoy left the immigration at 12 pm.

"If our immigration had been a little late, we might have also been victims of this tragedy. It is by the grace of Mahadevi that we were able to get out of there safely,"

"There was a huge loss wherever we stayed and ate," said Shailesh Maheshwari.

All the people in the convoy are deeply distressed after the news of the accident. The places where they stopped, ate and spent the night have also been severely damaged. "As a human being, when such a big incident comes to light, it is natural for a person to become disturbed.

14-day journey, now the government will decide the return route.

The convoy left Gujarat on August 22 and stayed in Nepal for two nights. During the total 14-day journey, they were supposed to return via the same route, but it has been learned that this route is currently closed.

The convoy is currently at an altitude of about 14,000 feet in China. The tourists are currently being given rest so that their bodies can get used to the climate here. According to Shailesh Maheshwari, the return route will be decided only after the decision on the situation and route of the governments of China and Nepal.

'Our journey has just begun'

"Our journey has just begun. We will go to Mansarovar tomorrow. The next day we will reach the foothills of Kailash and will circumambulate Kailash for three days. The government will decide the route by which we will return."

Kulvir Singh from Mumbai: "There are no words for this incident"

Kulvir Singh from Mumbai, who was part of the convoy, said, "We had no idea that such an incident would happen. We had completed the immigration process and left. When we reached here the next day, we came to know that such a horrific incident had happened in Nepal. There are really no words to describe this incident."

The convoy of 43 Gujaratis is currently safe in China, but the news of the devastation in the same places in Nepal that passed before their eyes just a few hours ago is constantly distressing them.

Tourists from Rajkot were supposed to stay where the complete devastation took place.

## 'Mom, I am in a lot of trouble, I feel like committing suicide'

BJP leader's daughter-in-law in Surat calls mother-in-law 10 minutes before suicide

Nidhi Rajput, daughter-in-law of former BJP municipal vice-president Shashi Singh, committed suicide by hiding a suicide note in her underwear in Kadodara, Surat district. Nidhi had a last conversation with her mother-in-law just 10 minutes before committing suicide, an audio clip of which has surfaced.

In this audio, it is clearly heard that Nidhi is in severe mental torture and pain. The last rites were completed after the forensic postmortem of Nidhi in the entire case. On the other hand, the police have detained the accused husband Saurabh Singh.

'I went to buy dosa and got a call': Mother-in-law's explanation

In the entire matter, mother-in-law Shashi Singh said that Nidhi felt like eating dosa, so I went to the market to buy dosa for her. During this, she suddenly got a call and for the first time told me that she was feeling suicidal. I explained to her and asked her to keep her mind calm and chant the name of God and told her that I was coming home immediately. Nidhi had never told me anything about any love affair of my son before.

Police have detained accused husband Saurabh Singh.

After Nidhi's death, Kadodara police have registered a case of abetment to suicide against husband Saurabh Singh and his girlfriend. Police have detained the main accused Saurabh Singh. They have started an in-depth interrogation about the husband's immoral

## Psycho killer who raped and murdered an elderly woman caught

Killed 4 people in a rickshaw in Rajkot, hanged by Sessions Court in rape case of a minor girl; Acquitted by High Court 3 months ago

Rajkot

On August 21, the police found the suspicious body of a 77-year-old woman from the banks of the Aji Dam in Rajkot. But many questions arose about whose body it was and who killed it. While checking the missing person report, the police found a report filed by the Kuwadwa police on August 20. Based on this, the police checked the CCTV and saw a

man taking the old woman away in a rickshaw.

When the police caught this rickshaw driver and interrogated him, he said, "I am Ramesh Vaidhukia." He confessed to the rape and murder before the police. Along with this, it also comes to light that he is not an ordinary person but a serial killer who also raped. The police arrested Ramesh late

last night.

Accused Ramesh is a psycho killer and has committed 4 murders. In 2018, a 3-year-old girl was kidnapped in Rajkot itself, raped and murdered. In this case, the Special POCOS Court of Rajkot had sentenced him to death in 2020. However, the High Court had acquitted him three months ago.
