'Very poor' Delhi air quality triggers political slugfest

AS AIR POLLUTION levels rose the day after Diwali, the Delhi government led by the Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP) alleged the Aam Aadmi Party (AAP) had "forced" farmers in Punjab to burn stubble to foul the capital's air.

The 24-hour average air quality index (AQI) at 4 pm on Tuesday was 351 (very poor), up from 345 on Monday.

At a press conference, Delhi Environment Minister Manjinder Singh Sirsa showed pictures and videos of people with their faces covered, burning paddy stubble.

"I want to show you how the Aam Aadmi Party [which rules Punjab] is deliberately forcing farmers to burn stubble in Punjab by covering their faces... Farmers have been forced to burn stubble by covering their faces, so that this can impact Delhi," Sirsa said.

"Diwali is not a BJP festival; it's a Sanatan Hindu festival. They (AAP) are our opposition, so they can abuse us, but why insult a sacred tradition? The same party that failed for 10 years [while ruling Delhi] is now blaming Diwali for pollution, a false narrative to appease a section of voters..." Sirsa said.

The minister said AAP was speaking the language of "those who admire Aurangzeb and Akbar, who even put up the picture of Tipu Sultan in the Vidhan Sabha... Arvind Khan, Arvind Kejriwal, is trying to hide his failures by defaming a festival sacred to millions," Sirsa said.

Responding to Sirsa, AAP Delhi unit president Saurabh Bharadwaj said: "When asked about missing pollution data in a press conference, a BJP minister remained evasive. As for Punjab Sikh farmers, I can say they will never conspire to defame Diwali. Accusing them is shameful."

"Sikh Gurus gave lives for Hindus, accusing them is a sin. Running the government is a responsibility; by lying about air pollution and Yamuna pollution, you are playing with the lives of people and children."

Farm fires in Punjab have been at an all-time low this year — the state has recorded only 353 instances of stubble-burning between September 15 and October 20. This figure was 1,445 for the same period last

Over 3-fold jump in farm fires in Punjab in 10 days

THE NUMBER OF stubble burning incidents in Punjab has reached 353 so far this season, with Tarn Taran and Amritsar districts accounting for the majority of such cases, according to data from the Punjab Pollution Control Board (PPCB).

In the last 10 days, the state has reported more than three-fold jump in farm fire incidents, the PPCB data showed. Till October 11, 116 such cases were reported.

At 125, Tarn Taran district

has witnessed maximum stubble burning cases so far, followed by Amritsar with 112 cases as many farmers continue to burn crop residue, ignoring the state government's appeals to stop the practice. Punjab saw 353 farm fire incidents between September 15 and October 20, according to the PPCB data.

Among other districts, 27 stubble burning cases have been reported in Ferozepur, 23 in Patiala and eight in Sangrur. —PTI

year, and hit an all-time high of 9,399 in 2020, the year in which the Indian Agricultural Research Institute (IARI) started maintaining farm fire data.

Overall, 1,461 fire incidents have been recorded in Uttar Pradesh, Punjab, Haryana, Rajasthan, Madhya Pradesh, and Delhi so far. Uttar Pradesh has seen 557 incidents (38%), the most so far. Madhya Pradesh has reported 285 incidents (20%), and Rajasthan 212 (15%). All these states are ruled by the BJP.

Experts have noted that floods and heavy rain in North-west India delayed the paddy harvest in Punjab this year. This means that farm fires, too, have been delayed, as the crop is yet to be harvested in many areas.

An analysis of particulate matter (PM) 2.5 trends over the years carried out by research and advisory group Climate Trends shows that post-Diwali pollutant levels this year were the highest in five years.

The Supreme Court allowed 'green' crackers this year, with a direction to the district administration and police to ensure that fireworks were restricted only to two time slots — 6 am to 7 am and 8 pm to 10 pm on Chhoti Diwali (Sunday) and Diwali (Monday). But this direction was flouted

widely, with violations being reported from across NCR. Real time data from the Delhi Pollution Control Committee (DPPC) showed PM2.5 and PM10 concentrations breached safe limits by 15 to 18 times at several stations.

Anand Vihar, Dwarka Sector 8, Patparganj, and Jahangirpuri recorded peaks above 1,400 to 1,800 µg/m³, which were 15-20 times higher than the permissible standards.

Hourly data showed sharper night-time spikes, with several stations recording PM2.5 and PM10 concentrations above 1,500 µg/m³, unlike last year when the highest spike was around 1525 µg/m³ at Nehru Nagar.

At several locations, data were missing for several hours between 11 pm and 5 am, suggesting possible instrument saturation due to extremely high particulate concentrations. DPPC officials did not respond to questions on the missing data.

In a social media post, Sirsa claimed that the rise in AQI this year was less than in previous years. "On the day of Diwali in 2023, the AQI was 218, and the next morning it rose to 301, meaning an increase of 83 points. On the day of Diwali in 2024, the AQI was 328, and the next day it was 360, meaning a difference of 32 points, and that too despite the firecracker ban and all sorts of restrictions.

\$100,000 H-1B fee won't apply to status change or renewals: USCIS

THE \$100,000 FEE imposed by the Trump administration on new H-1B visa petitions will not apply to applicants seeking a "change of status" or "extension of stay," according to fresh guidelines.

Issued by the US Citizenship and Immigration Services (USCIS) on Monday, the guidelines clarified the exemptions to President Donald Trump's September 19 proclamation, "Restriction on entry of certain non-immigrant workers," which will raise the fee for new H-1B visas to a steep \$100,000 (approx ₹88 lakhs).

"The Proclamation does not apply to any previously issued and currently valid H-1B visas, or any petitions submitted prior to 12:01 a.m. eastern daylight time on September 21, 2025," the USCIS said.

It added that the proclamation also does not prevent any current H-1B holder from trav-

The USCIS clarified that the fee does not apply to "change of status" cases where individuals switch categories without leaving the country, such as moving from F-1 student status to H-1B status.

"It says the fee only applies to

cases filed for people outside the United States, so they can come in," Dan Berger of Green & Spiegel told Forbes in an interview. "Employers were nervous about doing change of status because the \$100k might apply if they travel," he added.

The proclamation does not

apply to a petition filed at or after "12:01 a.m. eastern daylight time on September 21, 2025, that is requesting an amendment, change of status, or extension of stay for an alien inside the US where the alien is granted such amendment, change, or extension."

"Further, an alien beneficiary of such petition will not be considered to be subject to the payment if he or she subsequently departs the United States and applies for a visa based on the approved petition and/or seeks to re-enter the United States on a current H-1B visa."

However, if the USCIS determines that the person is "ineligible for a change of status or an amendment or extension of stay," then the fee would apply.

A beneficiary will not be considered to be subject to the payment if they subsequently depart the US and apply for a visa based on the approved petition and/or seek to re-enter the US on a current H-1B visa, it said.

Ola staff suicide: Police told not to harass CEO

Kin question money paid after death

THE KARNATAKA HIGH Court has directed the police not to harass Ola CEO Bhavish Aggarwal and other company officials during the investigation into an abetment to suicide case over the death of a 38-year-old engineer working at the ridesharing and transportation company firm.

A bench of Justice Mohammad Nawaz, while issuing a notice on October 17 seeking a response from the police, said, "The police... shall not harass the petitioners in the guise of investigation."

The court was hearing a

petition filed by Aggarwal, Subrat Kumar Dash, Head of vehicle homologations and regulations at Ola Electric, and Ola Electric Technologies for quashing of the abetment case and related proceedings, a stay on the investigation and a direction that no coercive action be taken against the petitioners.

Aggarwal, Dash and others were booked under Section 108 (abetment of suicide) of the BNS on October 6, days after Bengaluru resident K Aravind, who had been employed at Ola since 2022, allegedly died by suicide on September 28.

The FIR was registered after Aravind's elder brother, Ashwin Kannan, filed a police complaint detailing the allegations — ranging from harassment by Dash and Aggarwal to non-payment of salaries and incentives — that Aravind allegedly made in a 28-page note he left behind.

In his complaint, Ashwin also alleged that an unexplained transfer of ₹17.4 lakh had been made to Aravind's account two days after his death. "...all representatives of Ola Electric—came home and explained about the money transactions which were abrupt and did not have any logic. It looked like the firm

was trying to hide some information," said the complaint.

Ashwin said Aravind often spoke about the "toxic work culture" and the pressure employees went through at Ola Electric. "But we did not know that it would go to the extent where he would take his life. I will fight it out, whatever it may come," he said.

The "discussion" took place especially after Nikhil Somwanshi, 25, a machine learning engineer from Maharashtra working at Ola's AI unit, Krutrim, died by suicide in May, an incident that gained spotlight after an anonymous Reddit user claimed it was linked to "work pressure".

According to Ashwin, Aravind was drawing a salary of ₹2 lakh a month, "but I heard that there were some payment issues. The money credited to his account... had some payment from 2024."

Delhi to roll out Yamuna cruise service

THE DELHI GOVERNMENT is firming up preparations to launch its ambitious Yamuna cruise project by the last week of November as part of its efforts to rejuvenate the river and enhance recreational activities along its banks, officials said on Tuesday.

The proposed cruise service, between Sonia Vihar and Jagatpur, will be a significant tourism attraction in the city, they said.

Under the plan, the stretch of the Yamuna between the Wazirabad barrage and Jagatpur has been developed. —PTI
