Industrial metals drift on profit-taking



**London:** Copper prices fell on Friday, pressured by a stronger dollar and profit-taking as some investors locked in gains after the previous session's record high. Benchmark three-month copper on the London Metal Exchange dropped 2.2 per cent to \$13,319.50 a tonne by 1120 GMT. Aluminium fell 2.4 per cent to \$3,142 a tonne, zinc dropped 1.2 per cent to \$3,372, lead shed 0.4 per cent to \$2,005.50 and tin slid 3.7 per cent to \$52,655. Nickel lost 3.2 per cent to \$17,770. Palm oil snaps 4-month losing streak



**Jakarta:** Malaysian palm oil futures snapped a four-month losing streak on Friday, despite closing lower for the day as investors booked profits. It rose every week in January to book a 4.42 per cent gain, on a boost from higher soy oil and crude prices, supportive output and export data, while the ringgit also slipped. The benchmark palm oil contract for April delivery on the BMD was down 88 ringgit at 4,229 ringgit (\$1,073.62) a tonne. REUTERS

Crude oil slides as Trump signals dialogue with Iran



**London:** Crude oil prices fell nearly 1 per cent on Friday on signs that the US may engage in a dialogue with Iran over its nuclear programme, reducing concerns over potential supply disruptions from an US attack. Brent crude futures fell 68 cents to \$70.03 a barrel by 0958 GMT. US WTI crude dropped 72 cents to \$64.70. REUTERS

## Centre sets up high level panel to strengthen FPOs in Tamil Nadu

The government on Wednesday announced the formation of a high-level committee to strengthen farmer producer organisations (FPOs) in Tamil Nadu, where over 460 FPOs have been set up under a Central scheme and more than 1,000 producers' groups operate overall.

The committee has been asked to submit its report within two months.

"A high-level committee has been constituted to review their functioning and recommend measures to enhance their scale and reach," the Agriculture Ministry said in a statement. The move follows the intervention of Agriculture Minister Shivaraj Singh Chouhan, who directed timely action to address issues raised by FPOs through a comprehensive, field-oriented assessment.

During a recent visit to Erode, the Minister interacted with FPO members and took note of the operational, technical and market-related challenges faced by them.

The committee will in-

rain would be affected. The current crop being harvested would be impacted as the rain will lead to drying of cherry on the plant, resulting in less parchment.

Also, the next year's crop may be affected because of the early ripening and drop-

pings in June due to the large/uneven berry size," said Sahadev Balakrishna,

"Arabica harvesting is over in most of the places. It looks like a higher crop than last year. Robusta harvesting has started, but the crop may be lower than last year," Sahadev said.

Robusta plants need a stress break between the harvest and flowering for the

next season. The rain, which was untimely, didn't provide any break this year and was ahead of time.

## LACK OF BREAK

Normally, the robusta crop requires timely summer showers for blossoms during February-March and the backing showers, which are crucial for crop setting.

MJ Dinesh, Chairman, Coffee Board, said the January rain had created problems for robusta growers, who face some dropings. This could possibly impact the crop size, he said, adding that Board will take up the assessment by March-end.

"About half the crop is yet to be harvested and the rain has resulted in dropings, besides triggering flowering. Growers, who fear that the crop setting could be impacted, were hesitant to take up sprinkler irrigation for the backing showers as it would trigger blossoming of the remaining buds," said BS Jayaram, a grower in Mudigere and former President of the Karnataka Growers Federation.

The Coffee Board, in its initial post-blossom estimates for 2025-26, had pegged the crop at 4.03 lakh tonnes, comprising 1.18 lakh tonnes of arabica and 2.84 lakh tonnes of robusta.

growers. Shivanna expects that about 10-20 per cent of the current year's robusta crop may be lost due to the rain, while about 30 per cent of next year 2026-27's robust crop would be at stake.

"The untimely rain posed a technical challenge for robusta growers, who faced a dilemma in taking up the backing showers as the crop was not fully harvested. The ideal time for blossom showers for robusta is from February 15 to the first week of March, he said.

## IVPA asks govt to allot more to National Mission on Oilseeds

The Indian Vegetable Oil Producers Association (IVPA) has urged the government to raise the budgetary allocation for the National Mission on Oilseeds from ₹21,000 crore to ₹30,000 crore in the forthcoming Union Budget, citing the need to address structural bottlenecks in domestic oilseed production.

In a pre-Budget memorandum, IVPA President Sudhakar Desai said the enhanced allocation is critical to achieving edible oil self-sufficiency of about 45 per cent by 2030-32, amid rising import dependence and evolving agronomic challenges.

## OUTLAY EXPANSION

The additional funds, he said, could be strategically deployed across priority areas, such as development of high-yielding and climate-resilient seeds, technology upgradation, modern irrigation systems, expansion into rice fallow lands, strengthening processing and post-harvest infrastructure, and ensuring price assurance and market linkages.

"We also expect the

budgetary outlay for the NEMEO-OP to be extended from its 2025-26 deadline to 2030-31. This three-year extension would help mitigate delays caused by sapling shortages and infrastructural challenges, ensuring the longer-term success of the mission," he said.

Desai said achieving self-sufficiency would require easing acute liquidity constraints faced by processors, small refiners and oilseed crushers, which limit procurement and seasonal operations. To address this, IVPA has recommended sector-specific, low-cost credit with interest rates of 7 per cent or lower. The association also sought a regulatory review to allow domestic commodity exchanges for edible oils.

Further, IVPA sought the extension of a production-linked incentive scheme for the edible oil sector.

## Lower offerings lift orthodox tea leaf prices in Kochi auctions

Kochi

Orthodox leaf prices in Kochi auctions has witnessed a strong demand, thanks to reduced offerings that led an increase of ₹5 per kg in average price realisation.

The offered quantity in Sale 4 was 1,95,948 kg, registering 90 per cent sale. The whole leaf market was firm to dearer, while brokens remained steady to firm.

The auctioneers Forbes, Ewart & Figgis said that there was active support from CIS buyers, while a fair enquiry was noticed from Middle East buyers.

In CTC dust, good liquor ing teas were steady to firm. However, teas selling above ₹200 witnessed some resistance and were irregular and lower, noticing some withdrawal. The offered quantity was 5,66,642 kg, and all blenders together absorbed 75 per cent of the total CTC quantity sold, the auctioners said.

**SEASONAL CORRECTION** In orthodox dust, primary grades were barely steady to dearer, while secondary teas were irregular and lower. The offered quantity was 16,500 kg, and exporters and upcountry buyers absorbed a small quantity.

**Q4 2024.** However, this moderation in volume was more than offset by a sharp rise in value, with overall gold demand increasing 49 per cent year-on-year to approximately ₹303,470 crore," said WGC Regional CEO, India, Sachin Jain.

**DUAL IMPACT** "India's gold market in Q4 2025 clearly reflected the dual impact of record-high prices and shifting consumer behaviour. Total gold demand for the quarter stood at 241.3 tonnes, marking a 9 per cent decline compared to

Q4 2024.

However, the demand surged by 49 per cent to ₹3,03,470 crore from ₹2,03,070 crore in the same period of 2024.

India's gold demand declined by 11 per cent in 2025 and is expected to be around 700 tonnes this year, weighed down by record-high prices and changing consumer buying patterns, the World Gold Council (WGC) said in a report on Thursday.

Overall gold demand in India fell 11 per cent to 710.9 tonnes in 2025 and is expected to be between 600 and 700 tonnes in 2026, according to the WGC's Full-Year
