Trump Wraps Up Gulf Tour with \$1.4T Investment Pledge from UAE over 10 Yrs

Deals worth \$200b in oil and aviation sectors also signed, says White House

US President Donald Trump on Friday concluded his Gulf tour in Abu Dhabi after overseeing the signing of another raft of multi-billion-dollar deals, while also securing a \$1.4 trillion investment pledge from the UAE. The eye-watering amounts of money in investments were accompanied also by the lifting of decades-long sanctions on Syria and renewed optimism over an Iran nuclear deal during the multi-day trip across the Gulf. On his first foreign tour of his second term, Trump oversaw a \$200 billion order from Qatar Airways for Boeing jets and a \$600 billion investment from Saudi Arabia — including nearly \$142 billion in weapons, which the White House described as the largest-ever arms deal.

"I'm just thinking we have a president of the United States doing the selling," Trump quipped, during a business roundtable alongside Abu Dhabi Crown Prince Khalid bin Mohamed bin Zayed.

"I think I have to be a cheerleader for our country," he added. Following the business roundtable, the president briefly toured the Abrahamian Family

'Tariff Rates for Other Nations Within Weeks'

US President Donald Trump said he would set tariff rates for the country's trading partners "over the next two to three weeks," saying his administration lacks the capacity to negotiate deals with all of its trading partners.

Trump said Friday that Treasury Secretary Scott Bessent and Commerce Secretary Howard Lutnick "will be sending letters out essentially telling people 'what they'll be paying to do business in the United States.'"

"I think we're going to be very fair. But it's not possible to meet the number of people that want to see us," the President said during a meeting with business executives in the United Arab Emirates. The US President asserted there are "150 countries that want to make a deal." He didn't say how many, or which, nations would receive letters. The countries that get them "could appeal it," Trump added, without explaining how that process would work. The White House and Commerce Department didn't immediately respond to requests for comment overnight in the US. **Bloomberg**

The White House also said both countries inked an AI agreement that will see the UAE invest in US data centres and commit to "further align their national security regulations with the United States, including strong protections to prevent the diversion of US-origin technology".

OVER 93 KILLED IN GAZA: HEALTH MINISTRY

At least 93 people were killed by Israeli strikes in Gaza on Friday, the Gaza health ministry said. Strikes overnight hit across Gaza, including the outskirts of Deir al-Balah and the city of Khan Yunis. The ministry said hundreds more were injured in addition to those killed.

The widespread attacks across Gaza as Trump finishes his visit to Gulf states but not Israel. There had been widespread hope that his regional trip could usher in a ceasefire deal or renewal of humanitarian aid to Gaza. An Israeli blockade of the territory is now in its third month.

Speaking to reporters at a business forum in Abu Dhabi on the final day of his trip, Trump said he was looking to resolve a range of global crises, including Gaza. "We're looking at Gaza," he said. "And we've got to get that taken care of. A lot of people are starving. A lot of people are — there's a lot of bad things going on."

Iran Must Move Quickly on N-Proposal: US Prez

US President Donald Trump said the country had presented Iran with a proposal over Tehran's nuclear ambitions and that the country's negotiators needed to move soon on the offer as talks intensify.

"They have a proposal, more importantly they know they have to move quickly or something bad — something bad's going to happen," Trump told reporters aboard Air Force One. The President did not provide details on the proposal.

Meanwhile, Iran met with European powers on Friday to discuss its nuclear negotiations. The meeting in Istanbul followed remarks by Iran's foreign minister Abbas Araghchi warning of "irreversible" consequences if Britain, France and Germany move to reimpose United Nations sanctions that were lifted under a landmark 2015 agreement.

RUBIO MEETS NSAs OF EUROPEAN COUNTRIES

US Secretary of State Marco Rubio on Friday met the French, British and German national security advisors — French presidential adviser Emmanuel Bonne, Britain's Jonathan Powell, and Guenter Sautter, foreign policy advisor to the German chancellor — in Istanbul for talks on Iran and Ukraine, a US official said.

OVER 295 MILLION PEOPLE FACED ACUTE HUNGER LAST YEAR

Global Hunger at New High, 2025 Outlook Bleak: UN-backed report

More than 295 million people faced acute hunger last year, a new high driven by conflict along with other crises — and the outlook is "bleak" for 2025 as humanitarian aid falters, a UN-backed report said Friday.

It was the sixth consecutive annual increase in the number of people hit with "high levels" acute food insecurity according to the Global Report on Food Crises.

A total of 295.3 million people endured acute hunger last year — almost a quarter of the population in 53 of the 65 countries analysed for the report.

This was up from 281.6 million people in 2023, according to the report, which is drafted by a consortium of international organisations and NGOs.

The number of people facing famine reached 19 million, more than double from the previous year, according to the report.



A food security monitor warned on Monday that Gaza was at a "critical risk of famine" after more than two months of an Israeli aid blockade.

"The message is stark. Hunger and malnutrition are spreading faster than our ability to respond, yet globally, a third of all food produced is lost or wasted," he said.

Conflict and violence were the primary drivers in 20 countries and territories, where 140 million people faced acute hunger, the report found. Extreme weather was to blame in 18 countries and "economic shocks" in 15 nations, together affecting a total of 155 million people.

The deteriorating situations in Gaza, Myanmar and Sudan outweighed improvements in Afghanistan and Kenya.

The report warned that the outlook was "bleak" for 2025 as major donor countries have substantially reduced humanitarian funding.

"This is more than a failure of systems — it is a failure of humanity," Guterres said. **AFP**

\$34.5b Cable Giants Cox and Charter to Merge

Charter Communications has offered to acquire Cox Communications, in a \$34.5-billion merger that would combine two of the top three cable firms in the US.

Cox is the third largest cable television company in the country, with more than 6.5 million digital cable, internet, telephone, and home security customers. It has a strong foothold in states spanning from California to Virginia.

Charter Communications, known more widely as Spectrum, has more than 32 million customers in 41 states.

The cable industry has been under assault for years from streaming services like Disney, Netflix, Amazon and HBO Max, as well as plans offered by mobile phone firms. Comcast, which is of nearly equal size to Charter, spun off many of its cable television networks in November as consumers swap out their cable TV subscriptions for streaming platforms.

Charter said Friday that it will acquire Cox Communications' commercial fiber and managed IT and cloud businesses. Cox Enterprises will contribute Cox Communications' residential cable business to Charter Holdings, an existing subsidiary partnership of Charter. **AP**

Tesla Adds Chipotle Executive Hartung to Board of Directors

Tesla is adding a longtime executive of restaurant chain Chipotle Mexican Grill Inc to its board of directors. Jack Hartung will join as a director and member of the board's audit committee as of June 1, Tesla said Friday in a regulatory filing. Hartung had served as chief financial officer of Chipotle for more than two decades before transitioning to the role of chief strategy officer. **Bloomberg**
