Pay equal attention to tax collection & enrollment, says Sitharaman at Vapi

UNION FINANCE MINISTER Nirmala Sitharaman on Tuesday asked tax officials to pay "equal attention" towards Goods and Services Tax (GST) collection and widening of the tax-net.

Sitharaman was speaking at the inauguration of 12 GST Seva Kendras at Vapi, where state Finance Minister Kanu Desai as well as state and central GST officials were present.

"From now, I would want equal attention to be given to the collection of tax — the numbers are going up every month — but equally more establishments and businesses should get enrolled. The country should benefit from having a transparent tax regime in which everybody participates," she said.

The minister added that "staying out of the system is not good for the country." "By staying out, you believe — and that is a wrong belief — that you benefit, you do not come into the (tax) net and you are not noticed. But you are losing out on potential buyers of your products," she said. Sitharaman also said not providing bills to consumers making a purchase was not in

"national interest". "A consumer should make sure that he participates in the nation-building process. You are buying a product and demanding a bill, is a big step forward in transparency. It is a big step forward to make sure that the money that has to go for public causes, goes for it... So, to not bill a customer or to not give the bill to the customer — having obtained his money for the product — is not in the national interest," Sitharaman said.

She further said that "rates" of essential goods and services have come down compared to the pre-GST era. "Consumers know today that, post-GST, the rates that they pay in tax does not have double taxation or overlaps. Therefore, they are paying far less tax today for essential goods and services than what it was in the pre-GST era... GST has very efficiently brought the rates down," Sitharaman said.

Speaking on the occasion, Desai said, "Vapi gives direct and indirect employment to more than two lakh people and accounts for 10 per cent of Gujarat's GDP." He added that the foundation stone for Vapi, an industrial township, was laid by Moraji Desai, when he was the Union Finance minister.

'90% of Ahmedabad free of cattle', civic body tells HC

"AROUND 90 per cent of the streets of the city are now cattle-free" — this has been claimed by the Ahmedabad Municipal Corporation (AMC) in the Gujarat High Court in an affidavit.

The submission on Monday came after the Gujarat High Court chided Ahmedabad police, civic body as well as the state government for failing to control the cattle menace last month.

A division bench of the High Court on October 27 had expressed its anguish at the current state of lawlessness when it came to stray cattle control.

This was followed by a report by the Gujarat State Legal Services Authority (GSLSA) where it had concluded that the stray cattle menace is still rampant in Ahmedabad roads.

The state, on the other hand, submitted that in a state like Gujarat where agrarian activities are significantly high, "it would be almost impossible to show results at a pace ex-

pected" from the state authorities unless cattle owners are sensitised.

Now, in an affidavit filed by Deputy Municipal Commissioner Mihir Patel on Monday, the civic body submitted that between September 1 and November 5, 6,698 cattle were impounded compared to 2,632 cattle that were impounded by the civic body between July and August.

Further, the AMC said that cattle owners who do not have the facilities to maintain their cattle herds within the city limits, specifically land for such cattle, are being "motivated to

move their herds outside the city" and as a result, over the past 10 days, "no less than 14,585 number of cattle have been voluntarily moved out of the city by the cattle owners".

The civic body's affidavit adds that "it has been observed that the problem associated with stray cattle can only be resolved if the mindset of cattle owners is changed" and for this purpose, it has deployed 56 information, education, and communication (IEC) teams to educate the stakeholders about the 2023 cattle policy.

In the past 10 days, AMC

says, a total of 13 FIRs have been registered in connection with alterations of cattle owners and the civic body personnel, as per the affidavit.

In another affidavit filed by the state through BS Misry, Deputy Secretary of the urban development and urban housing department, in the 9-day period between October 27 and November 5, the Surat Municipal Corporation registered a total of 35 FIRs and Jamnagar Municipal Corporation filed another 72 FIRs.

Further, as of November 5, AMC has granted 17 permits or licenses out of the total 361 applications it received and rejected 114 other applications for want of compliance with criteria fixed under the 2023 Cattle Policy and another 230 applications are pending scrutiny.

The AMC also claims that the total number of stray cattle captured in its Smart City CCTVs has seen a sizeable reduction by 80-85 per cent after October 27, compared to September.

The court is due to take up the matter for a hearing on November 8.

Homeopathy doctor among 11 held for dacoity and vandalism at toll plaza near Veraval town

HOURS AFTER they allegedly vandalised Dari toll plaza on National Highway 51 near Veraval town in Gir Somnath early Monday, 11 men, including a homeopathy doctor, were arrested on charges of dacoity and house-trespass.

According to the FIR registered at Prabhats Patan police station in Veraval — based on a complaint filed by toll plaza supervisor Raju Barad — masked men came in a car and two motorbikes around 2.40 am, smashed nine of the 10 glass cabins of the toll booths with wooden sticks and pipes, damaged six computers and made away with a bag containing Rs

8,000 in cash. As the employees of the toll plaza got together, the accused sped away in their vehicle parked 150 m away from the toll plaza.

Anil Vaja, the son of Bijl village sarpanch and a homeopathy doctor, a person named Vipul and a few unidentified men were booked under sections 395 (dacoity), 450 (house trespass with intent to commit offence punishable with life imprisonment), 427 (mischievous causing damage of Rs 50) and 120B (criminal conspiracy) of the Indian Penal Code.

Less than 24 hours after the FIR was registered, teams of Local Crime Branch and Special Operations Group (SOG) of Gir Somnath district police detained 11 accused, including Vaja, and

handed them over to Prabhats Patan police station. They were later formally arrested.

"Anil Vaja is a homeopathy doctor and the son of sarpanch of Bijl village, also located on NH 51. Around two months ago, Vaja had a dispute with the Dari toll plaza staff over payment of toll tax and had assaulted the staffers. Vaja went to the toll

plaza with 10 of his friends, all residents of neighbouring Surrpada taluka, and vandalised toll booths and computers, among others," SOG Inspector Sunil Srani said.

"We managed to arrest Vaja from near Visavadar in Junagadh district and picked up the rest of the accused from other locations," he added.

How long will it take to clean India's air?



It is that time of the year when the air in and around Delhi become unbreathable. Haze and smog engulf the city, visibility drops sharply and face masks make a return. But bad air quality is not unique to Delhi. Most of the other cities in the country face the same problem, not just in winter but throughout the year.

It's been almost a decade since air pollution in India became a major issue. Lots of measures have been announced, and taken, to improve the country's air quality. But nothing much seems to have changed, especially during winter.

Air pollution is not an unsolvable problem. In fact, over the last few years, ample amount of data and information has been generated about the sources and causes of pollution, and ways to mitigate the impacts.

Why is the situation still not improving? How long will it take for our cities to have clean air? To discuss these, and related issues, The Indian Express has invited Gufran Belg, an environmental and atmospheric scientist, best known for his work on air pollution. Belg was founder director of SAFAR, System of Air Quality and Weather Forecasting and Research, a government-backed initiative to monitor and forecast air quality in select metropolitan cities, and has monitored the air quality situation over India for several years.
