Rohit Arya, the accused in the Pwaj hostage incident, haggled over tea prices and owed ₹6,000 to Unesh Tiwari, the tea vendor who first alerted Mumbai police about children being held hostage inside Mahavir Classic Building, Tiwari, who has run a tea stall outside the building for six years, told the FIR that Arya was a regular customer.

Despite Tiwari's crucial role, his statement remains unrecorded four days later

Following the incident, police have registered a case of negligence causing death against Ramesh Patel, owner of Khodal Enterprises.

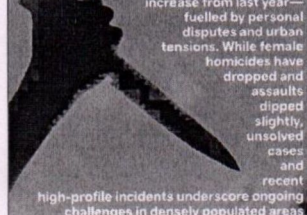

City's murder toll climbs to 98 in nine months

Mumbai's crime landscape in 2025 shows a troubling uptick in homicides, with 98 murders recorded in the first nine months—a 20% increase from last year—fuelled by personal disputes and urban tensions. While female homicides have dropped and assaults dipped slightly, unsolved cases and recent high-profile incidents underscore ongoing challenges in densely populated areas.



Rising homicides

Mumbai police data reveals 98 murders from January to September 2025, up from 78 in the same period of 2024, marking a 25.6% increase and raising concerns about escalating violent crime.

Attempted murders trend down

232 attempted murder cases were filed this year, a slight decline from 240 last year, indicating some progress in curbing non-fatal violence.

Impact on women

11 women were murdered in 2025 (down from 18 in 2024), with 10 cases solved and one perpetrator arrested, however, the recent Kalyan murder-suicide highlights persistent domestic risks.

Unsolved cases

Three of this year's murders remain unresolved, pointing to investigative gaps.

Positive shift in assaults

Sexual assault incidents fell marginally from 3,282 in 2024 to 3,054 in 2025, offering a silver of optimism.

Root causes

Most killings stem from domestic disputes, neighbourhood quarrels, drunken brawls, or old rivalries, concentrated in slums and high-density zones like Govandi and Sion.

High-profile incidents

October 30, Govandi Drug-addicted Sajid Gureshi, 23, allegedly stabbed co-owner vendor Mir Kasim Enul Nadab, 25, for drug money, accused arrested by Shivaji Nagar police. October 19, Sion (Pratiksha Nagar) Ram Singh Kalluram Yadav allegedly murdered his wife Chandavdi Yadav, 27, over infidelity suspicions.

What remains absent in planning is effort to reduce personal vehicle use and road congestion, except for Metro expansion which will take care of the roads. This will only happen if last-mile connectivity and safe, comfortable walking facilities are ensured. Authorities assume adequate auto and share-abouts will solve this, not realising, commuters suggest, operating Premium BRTS along the 487km Metro network, with a capacity of

Last-mile connectivity from MRTS stations will be handled by microbuses carrying 15 passengers at 10-12 second frequencies, replacing share-abouts and feeder minibuses. These services will make commuter waiting time under one minute and ensure universal accessibility.

With this 'Wait Only A Minute' model, there will be no need to check bus timings.

High-frequency services and level boarding will make travel seamless, with MRTS stations accessible within 500m and microbuses within 250m walk. Using a mobile app, commuters can enter origin and destination to get four route plans—two by time and two by cost-parity—and receive a QR-coded ticket. Except for Premium BRT and Premium Aggregator Taxi, all fares must remain affordable. The goal is to ensure citizens travel safely and comfortably, reach workplaces fresh, and contribute more productively to the city's GDP.
