Karnataka cabinet cleared withdrawal of 52 cases after review : Parameshwara

Karnataka Home Minister G

Parameshwara on Friday said the State Cabinet had decided to withdraw 52 criminal cases after a detailed legal review by a Cabinet Sub-Committee, asserting that each case was individually examined before clearance was granted. Defending the Cabinet's decision, Parameshwara said the cases involved Karnataka organisations, farmers' groups and several other organisations that had been seeking relief for many years through repeated representations to the government.



Kannada organisations, farmers' organisations, and several others had repeatedly submitted representations regarding cases filed against them. The matter was referred to the Cabinet Sub-Committee for examination," he told reporters here. He said the Sub-Committee scrutinised every case separately to determine whether there was sufficient legal basis for withdrawal. "Each case was discussed individually to examine whether it could be legally withdrawn. Jammu and Kashmir Lieutenant Governor (LG) Manoj Sinha on Thursday inaugurated a newly-constructed helipad in Katra to streamline helipad services for pilgrims visiting the Mata Vaishno Devi and Shiv Khori shrines. The facility, built at a cost of around Rs 27 crore, will improve connectivity and provide major relief to devotees travelling to the twin shrines, officials said, adding that helicopter



services from Katra to Shiv Khori will commence soon. Addressing reporters after inaugurating the helipad at Katra, Sinha said the Mata Vaishno Devi Board and the Shiv Khori Board both civil authorities have jointly developed the facility.

KTR alleges CM shielded POCSO accused, demands probe

HYDERABAD (AGENCY)

Bharat Rashtra Samiti (BRS) Working President K T Rama Rao (KTR) on Friday intensified his attack on Chief Minister A Revanth Reddy, alleging that the State Government deliberately shielded a POCSO accused for nine days and failed to protect the victim and her family. KTR also questioned why the accused was arrested only after the Telangana High Court reportedly refused to grant bail, and public criticism mounted against the government. The BRS working president criticised the Chief Minister's reported explanation that the police were occupied with arrangements for the Prime Minister's visit, calling it an "absurd excuse."



He alleged that the government failed to act promptly despite the seriousness of the case and demanded to know whether there had been any other instance in the country where a POCSO accused remained unarrested for such a long period. KTR further demanded an inquiry into reports that the accused was allegedly sheltered in a hospital linked to associates of the Chief Minister.

CG's rare flying squirrels caught between forest loss and live wire

RAIPUR: OPEN SEARCH

Flying squirrels, a rare gliding mammal found in Chhattisgarh's forest belts, are under pressure from a mix of old and new dangers. The animal, known for moving silently between trees at night, is now facing a deadlier landscape of power lines, shrinking canopy, summer heat and hunting pressure. Electrocuting from power lines is emerging as one of the major causes of concern. Officials said several flying squirrels have died in recent years after coming into contact with overhead



electric wires, while road accidents on forest routes have also added to the threat. On Thursday, a forest team spotted five flying squirrels gliding above and below power lines, prompting both excitement and alarm among field staff. "An accident could happen at any time. Today's sight was truly thrilling," a member of the team said.

Kashmir gets snow, Jammu swelters amid worsening rainfall deficit

JAMMU (AGENCY)

Even as his higher reaches of Kashmir received fresh snowfall and several areas witnessed rainfall, the seasonal rainfall deficit in Kashmir stood at 34.27 per cent below normal, while Jammu division recorded a deficit of 19.91 per cent. Residents of Jammu plains continued to endure an intense heatwave along with unshed power cuts despite repeated appeals to the government for uninterrupted electricity supply. The Gurez sector in Bandipora district was enveloped in snow late Wednesday evening, while Zojila Pass on the Srinagar-Leh highway and the Sonamarg area also witnessed snowfall. The plains of the Valley, including sum-



mer capital Srinagar, received intermittent rain. Heavy rainfall accompanied by thunderstorms caused extensive damage in Bandipora district, where a two spells of light rain at many places till Friday. "Weather is likely to remain generally dry during the forenoon with brief showers towards late afternoon at scattered places from May 23 to 25, while hot and dry conditions are

expected from May 26 to 28," the Centre said. Brief showers are also expected between May 29 and 31. Despite recent precipitation, Kashmir has recorded a sharp rainfall deficit of 34.27 per cent from March 1 to May 21 this year. Shopian, Kulgam, Budgam and Anantnag districts remain the worst affected, with deficits of 74 per cent, 55 per cent, 47 per cent and 48 per cent respectively. Jammu division recorded an overall deficit of 19.91 per cent during the same period. Official data also revealed an alarming weekly rainfall deficit across most districts from May 15 to 21, particularly in Jammu division, where the average shortfall stood at 85.69 per cent.

In Kashmir, average weekly rainfall was recorded at 11.92 mm against the normal 23.01 mm, while Jammu division received only 1.8 mm against the normal 12.58 mm. During the past week, Jammu district received just 1 mm rainfall amid the heatwave, while Kathua, Samba and Udhampur recorded no rainfall. Kishtwar and Reasi received only 0.8 mm and 0.4 mm rainfall respectively against the normal 26.2 mm during the week.

Govt urges staff to save fuel amid supply chain pressures

The state government has issued a circular urging all government officials and employees to adopt fuel-saving measures in light of mounting pressure on global fuel supply chains and rising concerns over energy conservation. In a directive issued by the General Administration Department, government staff has been advised to minimise fuel consumption by opting for public transport, carpooling and better travel planning wherever feasible. The circular also encourages departments to increasingly utilise virtual meetings and online communication platforms

instead of undertaking official travel. The advisory aligns with Prime Minister Narendra Modi's appeal for responsible energy use and the conservation of fuel resources. The state government stressed that all departments must ensure the economical use of government vehicles and transport facilities while avoiding unnecessary travel. Officials have been asked to carefully coordinate field visits and official programmes to reduce repeated trips and improve efficiency. Furthermore, the circular states that public transport should be preferred for routine commuting wherever practical, and employees should be encouraged to share vehicles through carpooling arrangements. The government noted that these measures are intended not only to reduce fuel consumption but also to promote environmental sustainability and responsible governance practices.
