Matrimony.com Q4 PAT up 20% at ₹9.7 crore

Chennai: Chennai-based online matrimony company Matrimony.com reported a profit after tax (PAT) of ₹9.7 crore for the fourth quarter ending March 2026, a 20 per cent year-on-year increase from the ₹8.1 crore logged in the same quarter last year. Revenue from operations went up to ₹117 crore against ₹113 crore in Q4 FY25. For the full year FY26, PAT went down to ₹34 crore against ₹45 crore in FY25. Revenue from operations also slipped to ₹460 crore (₹466 crore). In Q4 FY26, billings increased 9.9 per cent year-on-year to ₹126 crore.

Turkiye subsidiary drag hits Redington Q4 profit

Chennai: Chennai-based Redington reported a consolidated net profit of ₹288 crore for the fourth quarter ended March 31 — a 69 per cent drop from the ₹918 crore the company posted in the same quarter last year. Revenue from operations for the quarter stood at ₹33,213 crore, representing year-on-year growth of 25.6 per cent. The jump in losses was driven by impairment losses from one of company's subsidiaries in Türkiye, Redington said in an exchange filing.

Iran urges BRICS group to condemn 'international law violations' by US, Israel

Iranian Foreign Minister Seyyed Abbas Araghchi on Thursday called on the BRICS grouping to unequivocally condemn "violations of international law" by the US and Israel, and noted that resistance against US "bullying" was not an unfamiliar battle for member states.

Foreign Minister S Jaishankar, in his statement at the BRICS Foreign Ministers' meeting on Thursday, said safe and unimpeded maritime flows through international waterways, including the Strait of Hormuz and Red Sea, remain vital for global economic well-being.

"A sustained ceasefire, humanitarian access, and a credible pathway towards a durable and peaceful resolution remain essential. India supports a two-state solution where the Palestine issue is concerned," he said.

Araghchi, whose participation in the BRICS meet being hosted by India (BRICS Chair) on May 14-15 is important in the midst of the prolonged West Asia crisis, described Iran's confrontation with Western powers as

part of a broader struggle against "Western hegemony".

He emphasised that Tehran's actions were linked to the interests of BRICS nations and the wider Global South.

"This is of fundamental importance to the BRICS+ community because the battle in which Iran has stood is in defence of all

members and in defence of the new world we are building. Our brave soldiers have sacrificed their lives to confront Western hegemony and the immunity that America thinks it enjoys," he added.

PRACTICAL WAYS

The BRICS grouping includes Brazil, Russia, India, China, South Africa, Iran,

Egypt, Ethiopia, Indonesia, Iran, Saudi Arabia and the UAE.

Prime Minister Narendra Modi hosted top representatives from member countries on Thursday, including Russian Foreign Minister Sergey Lavrov, Iran's Abbas Araghchi, Brazil's Mauro Vieira, Indonesia's Sugiono and South Africa's Ronald Lamola. BRICS countries

needed to consider practical ways to strengthen cooperation amid the ongoing conflicts, economic uncertainties, and challenges in trade, technology and climate, Jaishankar said.

CHALLENGES FACED

"Many countries continue to face challenges on energy, food, fertilizer and health security, as also access to finance. BRICS can help them respond more effectively," he added. There is a growing expectation, particularly from emerging markets and developing countries, that BRICS will play a constructive and stabilising role.

"In this background, our discussions today are an opportunity to reflect on global and regional developments, and to consider practical ways to strengthen our cooperation," he said.

Lavrov, Jaishankar discuss trade, sustainable currency, logistics in bilateral meet

Russian Foreign Minister Sergey Lavrov and his Indian counterpart S Jaishankar discussed trade and economic cooperation and developing sustainable currency, financial, transport and logistics mechanisms in their bilateral meeting on Wednesday, according to the Russian government.

"The Foreign Ministers discussed key issues on the bilateral agenda, as well as the schedule of upcoming contacts, including at the highest level," per a social media post by the Russian Embassy in India on Thursday.

They highly praised the potential for cooperation in advanced technologies, energy and the peaceful use of outer space.

Lavrov is in India to participate in the BRICS Foreign Ministers' meet on May 14-15 and also called upon Prime Minister Narendra Modi on Thursday. "The sides noted their strong commitment to further advancing the special and privileged strategic partnership, expanding trade and economic cooperation, and consistently developing sustain-

able currency, financial, transport and logistics mechanisms," the post highlighted.

GEOPOLITICAL ISSUES
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"The Ministers recognised the importance of strengthening the multipolar architecture of interstate relations and building a global economic system based on the principles of equality and justice," it said.

They underscored their mutual intention to continue coordinating approaches in multilateral formats — at the UN, as well as the SCO, BRICS and the G20. Russian President Vladimir Putin is expected to visit India in September this year to attend the annual BRICS Summit.

Congress ends suspense, picks VD Satheesan as Kerala CM

The Congress on Thursday ended days of uncertainty over the Kerala chief ministership, announcing VD Satheesan as leader of the Congress Legislature Party (CLP) after a prolonged internal struggle, in which the party's top leadership weighed competing claims till almost the very last minute.

Making the announcement at the AICC headquarters on Akbar Road, AICC general secretary in charge of Kerala Deepa Dasmunshi said: "The CLP had met in Thiruvananthapuram on May 7. It had unanimously resolved to authorise the Congress president to appoint the new leader of the CLP in Kerala. Accordingly,

the Congress president has held extensive discussions with the chairperson of the Congress Parliamentary Party, leader of the opposition in the Lok Sabha, the AICC observers who had met the newly-elected MLAs and many other leaders of the State. Based on all these discussions, it has been decided that VD Satheesan be appointed as leader of the CLP." The decision came 10 days after the Congress-led UDF's Assembly election victory and only after hectic parleys involving the party's central leadership.

Party sources said the Congress high command struggled to balance organisational equations with political considerations as rival camps pressed their claims before Rahul Gandhi and Priyanka Gandhi Vadra till Thursday morning.

While KC Venugopal was

believed to have the backing of a significant number of MLAs and strong organisational influence within the party, Satheesan eventually emerged as the preferred choice because of his image as a grassroots leader, who directly led the Congress campaign in the State and

was widely credited within the party for helping engineer the UDF's return to power.

SIGNS OF UNEASE

But signs of unease within the party surfaced soon after the announcement. Senior Congress leader

and fellow aspirant Ramesh Chennithala was reportedly unhappy with the decision and indicated that he might skip the CLP meeting and stay out of the new Cabinet, underlining the factional challenges Satheesan could face even after securing the top post.

Satheesan was characteristically gracious towards Venugopal and Chennithala, who lost out in the race.

Speaking before the CLP meeting, he said: "I see this responsibility as a divine calling. It is not a personal gain. The AICC has helped us to make this success a reality. Everything was coordinated by AICC general secretary KC Venugopal. Our former Opposition leader (Chennithala) is my leader... We want to make new Kerala a reality. A person alone cannot deliver anything; only teamwork will do."

Amazon Bazaar sees 5-6x jump in orders in 2026

Amazon Bazaar, the commerce giant's value shopping vertical in India, has seen a 5-6 times year-on-year growth in orders in the first four months of 2026 against the same period in 2025. Launched in 2024 as a 'value shopping' experience for budget-conscious Indian consumers, Amazon Bazaar sells low-cost products for less than ₹600.

STRONG TRACTION

Speaking to mediapersons at a press briefing here on Thursday, Sameer Lalwani, Head-Amazon Bazaar, said the vertical had seen strong traction amongst both customers and sellers and now has a seller footprint of over 30,000 across the country.

The vertical has over 3 crore listed products.

"In 2025, our overall selection of products in Amazon Bazaar went up by 4X. We saw a 10X growth in the

number of transacting customers, the number of orders and the number of units that customers were buying. The momentum has been very strong," he said.

Lalwani added that women's fashion alongside home and kitchen appliances are the strongest categories with Amazon Bazaar with the two product groups contributing almost 50 per cent of all the items sold. Other products sold through the vertical include electronic accessories, beauty products and footwear.

Interestingly, he mentioned that out of the 3 crore products sold through Amazon Bazaar nearly 2 crore are in the sub-₹300 price category, reflecting high traction for ultra low cost products. On Amazon Bazaar's performance in Tamil Nadu, he said orders had increased 5X y-o-y. "Tamil Nadu now has over 1,700 sellers who are a part of Amazon Bazaar — 2X y-o-y increase in sellers in 2026," he said.

Rupee hits record low for the fourth straight session

The rupee came close to the 96 per US dollar mark on Thursday as it was pressured by rising crude oil prices and continuous dollar outflows due to FPI sales from the domestic equity markets.

The Indian currency hit a record intra-day low (of 95.96 per dollar) as well as a lifetime closing low (of 95.7625, down about 6 paise against the previous close of 95.7050).

Amit Pabari, MD, CR Forex Advisors, said the rupee had now weakened more than 6 per cent against the US dollar since the West Asia conflict began, making it Asia's worst-performing currency in 2026 so far.

India tops Asia-Pacific in AI maturity, deployment: IDC

India is among the most advanced countries in the Asia-Pacific region in terms of AI maturity, moving ahead of Australia and several other markets in adopting and deploying artificial intelligence (AI), according to an IDC report prepared in partnership with Dell Technologies.

The report on AI sovereignty said India, along with Japan, South Korea and Singapore, have progressed beyond the evaluation stage and is now entering phases of

testing, deployment and early mission-scale enablement.

This marks a shift from assessing AI capabilities to structured experimentation and building operational capacity.

In contrast, countries such as Australia, New Zealand, Malaysia and Indonesia remain focused on evaluating sovereign AI technologies and gauging institutional readiness before wider adoption.

Despite the growing momentum, the report noted that investments continue to be measured and phased.



APPROACH WITH CARE

Governments across the region are prioritising foundational capabilities, including data readiness, security safeguards and governance frameworks, before commit-

ting to largescale AI deployment.

Due to this, sovereign AI adoption across the region remains largely exploratory, reflecting a deliberate and risk-managed approach suited to mission-critical public sector environments.

Governments in South Korea and India have stressed the high costs associated with sovereign infrastructure and specialised compliance capabilities.

COST EFFICIENCY

To address this, India is prioritising shared national AI infrastructure to improve

cost efficiency while expanding access to trusted compute resources. Across the region, governments pursue "selective sovereignty" to maintain strong control over sensitive data, critical systems, and regulated workloads, while continuing to leverage global technology ecosystems for innovation and scale.

Hybrid sovereign models that combine on-premises infrastructure and sovereign cloud environments with broader ecosystem access are emerging as the preferred deployment approach, per the report.
