53 candidates ineligible, AMC cancels ad to hire fire officers

THE AHMEDABAD Municipal Corporation (AMC) on Thursday said that it has cancelled the advertisement it had issued in June for the recruitment of chief fire officer (CFO), additional CFO and two deputy CFOs as no suitable candidate has been found.

The notification stated, "During the recruitment process, since no candidate was found to have suitable eligibility or experience, the recruitment advertisement has been cancelled." The advertisement was issued on June 22.

Chief fire officials said while 53 candidates had applied for the posts, they were later deemed ineligible, including 19 candidates who had applied for the post of CFO of Ahmedabad.

Arun Shah, Deputy Municipal Commissioner (Administration), said, "We cancelled the recruitment because we didn't find eligible candidates. But we will issue another advertisement with updated recruitment rules."

The top four posts of the Ahmedabad Fire and Emergency Services (AFES) have been vacant for years since the last full-time, MFD, Dastoor, retired on January 31.

SMC-RUN SCHOOL

46 children given leaving certificates in 7 months, principal suspended

THE PRINCIPLE OF cradle-to-the-grave school has been suspended and a show cause notice has been issued to two resource coordinators in Surat after the Surat Municipal School Board (SMSB) learnt that 46 students (below Class X) were allegedly given leaving certificates between January to July this year.

2021. While additional CFO Rajesh Bhatt was made the charge CFO for one year (February 2021 to February 2022), deputy CFO Jayesh Khodia has held the post since March 2022.

The post of additional CFO has remained vacant since the end of February 2022 when Rajesh Bhatt retired. Deputy CFO Mithun Mistri was retained as the additional charge of the post since March 2022.

Of the four posts of deputy CFOs, while two have been filled by Khadia and Mistri, the rest have been vacant for over a decade.

Notably, seven of the eight posts of CFO in nine major cities of Gujarat have been vacant for years. Only Jamnagar city has a full-time CFO at present; it was only appointed in January 2022.

It is not clear if the recruitment drive, which includes 19 candidates from various categories, has had any success so far.

Out of the other five four shops are owned by Rajkot residents. Workers from Rajkot, Maharashtra and Gujarat were found to be working in these shops, police said.

SOG head constable Jignesh Amreya in his complaint said: "It has come to notice that parapatriya (people from outside) are living in Rajkot as tenants and are decamping after committing crimes."

The accused have been booked under Bharatiya Nayaka Sanhita's Section 223 (disobedience to order duly promulgated by public authority).

One of the employees informed us about their tenants or workers, we write to the concerned police station in their places to seek details of their criminal antecedents; if any, in case of theft it becomes easier to track the accused," police inspector in-charge of B Division police station S.M. Jadeja said, adding, "We are arresting landlords/owners/banked under BNS Section 223. Because it is a bailable offence, we grant them bail in due course."

Police crack down on landlords not sharing info on migrant labourers, 55 cases filed this month

On Wednesday, seven cases were registered at Rajkot's B Division police station after a team of the Special Operations Group (SOG) raided multiple premises on Sant Kabir Road.

The administrative officer also slapped a show-cause notice on Urban Resource Coordinator (URC) Ranjeet Patel and Cluster Resource Coordinator (CRC) Sonal Patel for "not reporting the matter to the concerned authority."

Urban and cluster resource co-ordinators are teachers specifically recruited to undertake inspections at government and primary schools.

On Thursday, Mehal Patel,

along with SMSB chairman Ragnendrakumar Kapadia, visited the school and spoke to the teachers, students, and other residents from the school record.

Zainkrishi could not be reached despite multiple attempts. We have set up a five-

THUMPING WELCOME

ON THE first day of the three day Monsoon Session of the Gujarat Legislative Assembly, newly-elected BJP MLAs Arjun Modhwadia and C.J. Chavda were given a thumping welcome by their party legislators as they entered the House and took seats on the right side of the Chair. Both Modhwadia and Chavda, former Congress legislators, won by-election from Porbandar and Vapijor constituencies respectively. After the simultaneous Lok Sabha and by-elections, the Congress which had won 17 seats in 2022 assembly polls, was reduced to 12 MLAs in the House – with the total strength of 182 – with the BJP having 161 legislators.

Two Bangladeshi minors rescued, trafficker arrested

Armenelal: The Crime Branch of Ahmedabad Police Thursday arrested a man accused of luring the families of minor girls in Bangladesh with the prospect of a job, trickling them to India and then thrusting them into sex trade in Gujarat.

The Crime Branch arrested 26-year-old Sagar Milan Mandal, a native of North 24 Parganas in West Bengal, from a rented apartment in the Vastrapur area. The police also found two minor girls in the apartment who were working as prostitutes.

Sagar has been booked under BNS sections 64 and 64 (2-M) for committing rape, abducions, transfers persons for exploitation, 141 (engaging in sexual exploitation knowing that the child has been trafficked) and 54 (prosecution of abductor when crime is committed). Sections 4 and 5 of the Immoral Traffic Prevention Act, as well as sections 3(3), 3(1), 11(6) and 12 of the POCSO Act.

Upon probing the girl's identity and speaking to their mothers in Bangladesh, the officials learnt that Mandal and his Bangladeshi accomplice, Mohiuddin Karim Mondal, approached the families of the minors about two-and-a-half months ago offering jobs for their daughters in Ahmedabad.

The accused trafficked the girls to India after which they were brought to the rented apartment. Sagar Mandal also allegedly raped one of the minors. The girls were then allegedly pushed into sex trade through which the accused were profiteering.

Sagar has been booked under BNS sections 64 and 64 (2-M) for committing rape, abducions, transfers persons for exploitation, 141 (engaging in sexual exploitation knowing that the child has been trafficked) and 54 (prosecution of abductor when crime is committed). Sections 4 and 5 of the Immoral Traffic Prevention Act, as well as sections 3(3), 3(1), 11(6) and 12 of the POCSO Act.
