Independent Auditors' Report

Report on Audit of Standalone Audited Financial Results

Opinion

We have audited the accompanying standalone financial results of **Valiant Laboratories Limited** ("the Company") for quarter ended 31st December 2025 and year to date results for the period 1st April 2025 to 31st December 2025 ("the financial results) attached herewith being submitted by the Company pursuant to the requirement of Regulation 33 of the SEBI (Listing Obligations and Disclosure Requirements) Regulations, 2015, as amended ("Listing Regulations").
