### III. Additional Notes

1. The financial results have been prepared in accordance with the recognition and measurement principles laid down in Indian Accounting Standards ('Ind AS') notified under the Companies (Indian Accounting Standards) Rules, 2015, (as amended) as specified in Section 133 of the Companies Act, 2013.

2. The company is essentially an investing company focusing on earning income through dividend, interest and gain on investments held. Hence the Company's business activity falls within a single business segment i.e investment and therefore segment reporting in terms of IND-AS 108 on operating segment is not applicable.

3. The financial results has been reviewed by the Audit Committee at its meeting held on May 22, 2026 and approved by the Board of Directors at its meeting held on May 23, 2026. The statutory auditors have expressed an unmodified conclusion on the aforesaid results.

4. The figures for the quarter ended March 31, 2026 and March 31, 2025 are the balancing figures between audited figures in respect of the full financial year and the published year to date figures upto December 31, 2025 and December 31, 2024 respectively which were subject to limited review by statutory auditors.

5. The Government of India, vide Notification dated November 21, 2025, has notified the Code on Wages, 2019, the Industrial Relations Code, 2020, the Code on Social Security, 2020, and the Occupational Safety, Health and Working Conditions Code, 2020 (collectively referred to as "the Labour Codes"), which consolidate and replace existing multiple labour legislations. In accordance with Ind AS 19 - Employee benefits, changes to employee benefit plans resulting from the new labour codes are treated as plan amendments, requiring immediate recognition of past service cost as expense in the statement of profit and loss. This approach is consistent with the guidance issued by the Institute of Chartered Accountants of India. In view of this, the Company has evaluated the impact and recognised past service costs amounting to Rs. 0.02 Crores which has been included under employee benefit expenses in the standalone financial results for the year ended March 31, 2026. The Company continues to monitor developments on the rules to be notified by regulatory authorities, including clarifications/ additional guidance from authorities and will continue to assess the accounting implications basis such developments/ guidance.

6. The Board of directors has recommended a dividend of Rs. 5/- per share on fully paid up equity shares of the company.

### Opinion

### III. Additional Notes

1. The financial results have been prepared in accordance with the recognition and measurement principles laid down in Indian Accounting Standards ('Ind AS') notified under the Companies (Indian Accounting Standards) Rules, 2015, (as amended) as specified in Section 133 of the Companies Act, 2013.
2. The company is essentially an investing company focusing on earning income through dividend, interest and gain on investments held. Hence the Company's business activity falls within a single business segment i.e. investment and therefore segment reporting in terms of IND-AS 108 on operating segment is not applicable.
3. The consolidated financial results includes result of its associates - viz Vardhman Textiles Limited and Vardhman Spinning & General Mills Limited.
4. The financial results has been reviewed by the Audit Committee at its meeting held on May 22, 2026 and approved by the Board of Directors at its meeting held on May 23, 2026. The statutory auditors have expressed an unmodified conclusion on the aforesaid results.
5. The figures for the quarter ended March 31, 2026 and March 31, 2025 are the balancing figures between audited figures in respect of the full financial year and the published year to date figures upto December 31, 2025 and December 31, 2024 respectively which were subject to limited review by statutory auditors.
6. The Government of India, vide Notification dated November 21, 2025, has notified the Code on Wages, 2019, the Industrial Relations Code, 2020, the Code on Social Security, 2020, and the Occupational Safety, Health and Working Conditions Code, 2020 (collectively referred to as "the Labour Codes"), which consolidate and replace existing multiple labour legislations. In accordance with Ind AS 19 - Employee benefits, changes to employee benefit plans resulting from the new labour codes are treated as plan amendments, requiring immediate recognition of past service cost as expense in the statement of profit and loss. This approach is consistent with the guidance issued by the Institute of Chartered Accountants of India. In view of this, the Group has evaluated the impact and recognised past service costs amounting to Rs. 0.02 Crores which has been included under employee benefit expenses in the consolidated financial results for year ended March 31, 2026. The Group continues to monitor developments on the rules to be notified by regulatory authorities, including clarifications/ additional guidance from authorities and will continue to assess the accounting implications basis such developments/ guidance.
7. The Board of directors has recommended a dividend of Rs. 5/- per share on fully paid up equity shares of the company.
