10 engineers held for duping students in admission scam

Mumbai, August 17

TEN ENGINEERS, including five IITech graduates from reputed institutes, have been arrested by the Powal police for allegedly running a fake admission racket through two call centres in Pune and cheating students and parents across the country on the promise of securing engineering college seats under management and NRI quotas.

Police said the accused had been operating the racket since 2019, targeting students during the March-July admission season. They allegedly collected lakhs of rupees and shut down operations before admission lists were announced.

Police have seized assets worth Rs 1.35 crore allegedly linked to the racket, including a BMW and a Jaguar. Rs 24 lakh in bank accounts has been frozen, police said.

The alleged mastermind, Sonu Kumar, 35, is a B.Tech graduate from a prominent Pune-based institute. Police said he had been running the racket for more than six years and had purchased three cars in his friend's name using money allegedly earned through the fraud.

The case came to light after Grace Priya Swami, 47, a Powal resident, approached police alleging she was cheated of Rs 16.5 lakh. According to her, she was contacted through an Instagram account, "techorbit1117", and promised admission for her son to IIT Hyderabad.

Police registered a case under relevant sections of the Bharatiya Nyaya Sanhita (BNS).

During the investigation, police traced the accused to a rented apartment in Viman Nagar and detained 10 suspects on Saturday.

AiMIM corporator Mateen Patel granted bail in TCS Nashik case

A NASHIK court on Monday granted bail to AiMIM corporator Mateen Patel, who was booked for allegedly sheltering Nashik TCS sexual harassment case accused Nida Khan.

Additional Sessions Judge Kedar Rajaram Joglekar granted Patel bail on a bond of Rs 75,000 with one or two sureties of the same amount.

While allowing the plea, the court noted that Patel had not been arrested during the police investigation. He had instead been issued a notice under Section 85(3) of the Bharatiya Nyaya Sanhita and was allowed to remain out of custody. The investigating officer had also not sought his custody, the court noted.

Patel was later served a notice after the chargesheet was filed but he failed to appear before the court. A non-bailable warrant was then issued against him. He was produced before the court on August 7 and sent to judicial custody. The court observed that his custody was not required, pointing out that he had remained out of custody throughout the investigation.

Patel was booked under Section 249 of the Bharatiya Nyaya Sanhita for allegedly harbouring an offender, besides provisions of the Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes (Prevention of Atrocities) Act.

Police had named Patel as an accused after Khan was arrested in Chhatrapati Sambhaji Nagar in May. Police alleged that Patel had helped her stay at a property while she was evading arrest.

Patel, during his questioning by the police, had denied knowing about the allegations against Khan.

CJI SURYA KANT REPLACED

TMM director is new chief guest for Aug 22 convocation at TISS

TATA MEMORIAL Hospital director Dr C S Pramesh will be the chief guest at the 86th convocation of the Tata Institute of Social Sciences (TISS) on August 22, replacing Chief Justice of India Surya Kant, whose scheduled appearance at the ceremony earlier this month was followed by his last-minute postponement.

The convocation was originally scheduled for August 2, with the CJI slated to be the chief guest. The institute postponed the event two days before the ceremony, citing "unforeseen circumstances" and saying it could not be held in a "conducive environment".

TISS had not disclosed the circumstances, but students and officials had cited con-

cerns over possible protests and security arrangements linked to the CJI's visit. In an official statement, the institute said the ceremony could not be held in a "conducive environment" and that proceeding as scheduled could have affected the well-being of students, faculty, staff, dignitaries, guests and campus life.

The invitation for the rescheduled convocation now names Pramesh as chief guest. TISS authorities were unavailable for comment on whether the change followed a decision by the CJI to withdraw or was made by the institute amid security concerns.

The postponement had left graduating students and their families upset, with several having already made travel arrangements. TISS subsequently said financial assistance would be provided to affected students on a case-by-case basis.

The rescheduled ceremony will be held on August 22.

AFTER 19 MONTHS

Mahayuti names guardian ministers for Nashik, Raigad

AFTER KEEPING two of its most contested guardian minister posts vacant for nearly 19 months, the Maharashtra government on Monday appointed BJP minister Girish Mahajan for Nashik and Shiv Sena minister Bharat Gogawale for Raigad, ending a prolonged tussle within the Mahayuti.

The General Administration Department order dated August 17 records Mahajan as guardian minister of Nashik and Gogawale as guardian minister of Raigad.

The two appointments had become a bone of contention in the Mahayuti since January 2025.

Initially, Mahajan was appointed Nashik guardian minister on January 18 last year, but the decision was stayed the next day after the objection by the Shinde-led Sena. The party had sought Nashik for minister Dada Bhuse.

The appointment of NCP leader Aditi Tarkare as Raigad guardian minister was also stayed, with the Shinde-led Sena seeking the post for minister Gogawale.

The deadlock continued even as both districts saw competing claims from the three Mahayuti partners.

The dispute became particularly visible during Kumbh-mahajan taking a leading role in reviews and preparations while the question of the district's guardian minister remained unresolved.

The appointment now formally gives Mahajan both a direct role in Nashik and the responsibility of overseeing the district as its guardian minister.

The decision on Raigad gives the Shinde-led Sena the post it had sought since the original appointments were announced in January 2025.

Gogawale had remained the party's preferred choice for the district after Tarkare's appointment. His appointment now settles that part of the dispute.

105-DAY MARATHI CAMPAIGN

Migrant auto drivers say language lessons have eased communication

FOR 56-YEAR-OLD autrickshaw driver Lokanath Gupta, learning Marathi meant returning to the classroom after nearly four decades. After failing his first assessment, the Prerang native began practicing Marathi phrases with his children after his daily shift. He cleared the test on his second attempt.

Gupta was among drivers who gathered in Thane on Sunday for a certificate distribution ceremony marking the completion of the Maharashtra government's 105-day Marathi language campaign for autrickshaw and taxi drivers.

The event was attended by Deputy Chief Minister Eknath Shinde, Transport Minister Pratap Sarnik, Joint RTO Commissioner and Marathi Samiti president Ravi Gaikwad, and senior transport officials.

The statewide campaign, which concluded on August 5, was launched after the government announced that commercial passenger vehicle drivers would be required to have basic knowledge of Mar-

athi. The move followed an inspection by the Mira-Bhayandar RTO, which found several autrickshaw drivers lacking the basic proficiency prescribed under the Maharashtra Motor Vehicle Rules, 1989.

The programme was conducted through 59 RTOs, sub-RTOs and language training centres with the help of more than 4,500 teachers from the Konkani Marathi Sahitya Parishad and the Mumbai Marathi Sahitya Sangh. Drivers attended four one-hour sessions covering commonly used words and phrases, including asking passengers about their destination, discussing fares and responding to directions.

For many drivers, the classes helped overcome a hesitation they had developed despite years of hearing Marathi on Mumbai's streets.

"I could already understand basic Marathi phrases, but usually hesitated a little while replying to passengers in Marathi. Now that fear has reduced significantly," said Sheshmini Yadav, who is from Varanasi and has lived in Maharashtra since 2015.

For J.K. Mahendra Gupta,

who is from Jaunpur in Uttar Pradesh, practice with fellow drivers proved more useful than formal lessons alone. He said the difference between Marathi and the Hindi and Bhojpuri he spoke at home initially made it difficult to understand the language.

After their shifts, Gupta and five or six other drivers would meet at their usual spot and speak only in Marathi. They would practise phrases such as "kutha janyache" and "tanaka" through simple question-and-answer conversations.

For 46-year-old Suresh Yadav from Bilhar, the ability to speak even basic Marathi has also made dealing with government officials easier.

"At first in Marathi, I can now speak to officials confidently when I visit the RTO for vehicle fitness certification or other documentation work," he said.

The government said nearly 1.40 lakh autrickshaw and taxi drivers across Mumbai have completed the programme. Around 7,750 drivers who failed the assessment will be given another opportunity, while more than 14,000 drivers are yet to complete the training.

FOUR OF FAMILY FOUND DEAD

Navy sailor had taken parental leave in June, never returned to duty

Police suspect sailor killed wife, two kids before dying by suicide

A NAVY sailor, who allegedly killed his wife and two children before dying by suicide at their Navi Nagar home, had taken 15 days of parental leave in June but never returned to duty, the Cuffe Parade police said. Investigators are also looking into property and monetary disputes between the sailor and his siblings, which they suspect may have contributed to his depression. Police said the deceased had also been taking medication for depression.

The incident came to light on August 15 when the Cuffe Parade police received information about a man allegedly hanging himself at a residence in Navi Nagar. A police team found Purnamal Mehra, a sailor with the Indian Navy, dead. His wife Oma, their three-year-old son Yash and their two-month-old child were found unresponsive on a bed.

According to the police, Mehra had mental health issues and had been estranged from them over monetary and property-related issues. He had reportedly been depressed for around a year and had kept away from neighbours and relatives.

"We suspect that he had monetary and property-related issues with his siblings and was depressed for about a year. His neighbours stated that he largely remained silent and

never interacted with them. When his two-month-old child was born, no family member came for the visit," a police officer said.

Mehra's brother Brijbal told police that the two were not on good terms and had rarely spoken in recent months. "I did not share good relations with him and we rarely spoke with each other. He was in touch with my father and mother. We have not spoken with each other for the past five months," he told the police.

Police said Mehra had suffered seizures and was taking medication for depression and seizures. He had taken the 15-day parental leave in June following the birth of his second child but did not return to work after the leave, officials said.

The condition of the bodies has led police to suspect that Oma and the children may have died before Mehra. When the police reached the house, the bodies of the wife and children had already started decomposing, while there were no visible signs of decomposition on Mehra's body.

"This difference in the condition of the bodies suggests that the wife and children had died before Mehra survived for sometime after their deaths. We are investigating the exact sequence of events," police said.
