SpaceX files for IPO that could make Musk first trillionaire

ELON MUSK, WHO already enjoys the title of world's richest person, could soon have one more feather in his cap. The Tesla and SpaceX boss could become the world's first trillionaire as his space and AI company prepares to go public.

Musk, who is the majority owner in SpaceX, will see his wealth soar and could touch the trillion-dollar mark once the shares are available for trading. Musk's control of SpaceX comes

from 85% voting power that he has owing to the supervoting Class B shares that get 10 votes for every 1 vote held by Class A shares. The rocket maker that has been in existence since 2002 has made bold bets with ambitions ranging from colonising Mars to setting up AI data centers in space.

The shares are likely to list next month with Musk having around a month's time to market the IPO and gather support for the public listing.

Aramco's 2020 listing which saw the Saudi oil giant raising \$29.6 billion. It is not yet clear how much SpaceX

would raise from public but the papers filed with the Securities and Exchange Commission (SEC) revealed a tough financial

picture with losses mounting. The company reported losses of \$4.3 billion for the three months ended March.

The SpaceX merger with Musk's artificial intelligence startup xAI in February made things difficult for the space company because of the massive spending needs of the AI firm on building data centres in a highly competitive market. On the merger, Musk said that the coming together of these companies will create an "innovation engine" putting AI, rockets, space-based internet, and

media under one roof.

SpaceX also revealed that it has signed a deal with artificial intelligence startup Anthropic which will pay the Musk-owned company \$1.25 billion a month for access to its compute data centres. The deal period extends till May 2029.

The filing showed that SpaceX would trade on the Nasdaq exchange under the ticker symbol SPXC. The IPO would test investor interest in Musk's vast business interests even as he grapples with mounting challenges at Tesla.

TRUMP SAYS HE CAN WAIT FOR 'RIGHT ANSWERS' FROM IRAN

Tehran reviewing latest US response

Pakistan mediates between both sides

IRAN SAID ON Thursday it was reviewing Washington's latest position on ending the war after US President Donald Trump suggested he was prepared to wait a few days to "get the right answers" from Tehran but warned of renewed attacks if it did not agree to a deal.

"We have received US views and are reviewing them," Iranian state-run agency *Nour News* quoted foreign ministry spokesperson Esmaeil Baghaei as saying. Pakistan, which is acting as the conduit for messages between the two sides, continues to mediate between Tehran and Washington, he added.

Six weeks since a fragile ceasefire came into force, talks

to end the war have shown little progress, while soaring oil prices have raised concern over inflation and the impact on the global economy.

"Believe me, if we don't get the right answers, it goes very quickly. We're all ready to go," Trump said. Asked how long he would wait, he said, "It could be a few days, but it could go very quickly."

Trump reiterated his determination not to allow Iran to acquire a nuclear weapon. "We're in the final stages of Iran. We'll see what happens. Either have a deal or we're going to do some things that are a little bit nasty, but hopefully that won't happen," Trump said. "Ideally, I'd like to see few people killed, as opposed to a lot. We can do it either way."

War impact on economy

THE ENERGY SHOCK from the Iran war is seeping ever deeper into the European economy, presenting policy-makers with a dilemma as it simultaneously weighs on growth and pushes prices higher, a broad set of data showed. While most economists say this still cannot be compared

to the outright "stagflation" mix of high inflation and stagnant growth that accompanied the energy shocks of the 1970s, it will exacerbate the cost of living crisis that followed the COVID-19 pandemic and which millions of households are still facing. —REUTERS

'Uranium must stay in Iran'

IRAN'S SUPREME LEADER has issued a directive that the country's near-weapons-grade uranium should not be sent abroad, two Iranian sources said, hardening Tehran's stance on one of the main US demands. Ayatollah Mojtaba Khamenei's order could further frustrate Trump and complicate talks on ending war.

Samsung averts strike with big bonuses

THE AI BUILD out was in full swing, driving up demand for computer memory chips, an industry dominated by Samsung and another South Korean company, SK Hynix. Reflecting this new age of plenty, SK Hynix had in 2025 unveiled new, industry-leading perks: 10 percent of operating profit was set aside for worker bonuses. Caps for those bonuses were also removed.

company brought the workers to the brink of a strike, which was averted Wednesday night after an intervention by government mediators.

Under the provisional agreement, which abolished the bonus cap, Samsung is expected to set aside 10.5% of profits for bonuses. In the first three months of this year, the company's profit soared to \$39 billion. The union will vote on whether to finalise the deal by next Wednesday.



In recent days, Samsung's largest labor union made a similar request in its negotiations — that the company commit 15 percent of its operating profit for performance bonuses for the semiconductor division, and to remove a cap that limits individual bonuses.

Disagreements with the

largest employer, Samsung Electronics is a critical pillar of the country's economy. It and SK Hynix together account for over 40% of the total market capitalisation of the Kospi, South Korea's main stock index, while semiconductor makers up about a third of South Korea's total exports.

More steps to check CAD on the anvil

"WE HAVE MADE an appeal to all citizens to be more conscious about their spending on products which are import-dependent. And I think it's just very natural that every Indian who trusts Prime Minister (Narendra) Modi has taken cognisance of that, and is helping the country in every small or big way with their own actions."

India's CAD could more than double to 2% or higher of the gross domestic product in FY27 from below 1% in FY26, Chief Economic Adviser V Anantha Nageswaran said recently.

"The current account deficit could widen from less than 1% of GDP to anywhere near 2% or 2%-plus of GDP, which we have to finance," he said, adding that India must remain attractive for both domestic and foreign investments.

According to recent news reports, which could not be independently verified by FE,

the government is also considering steps to boost capital inflows like a significant reduction in the taxes paid by foreign investors on Indian bonds. Specifically, the government could reduce withholding tax on interest income of overseas bond investors to 5% from 20% and expedite the rollout and raise the outlays for the Export Promotion Mission (EPM). The authorities want to align policies with global norms and attract inflows, these reports said, adding that the Reserve Bank of India recommended the move.

"Deliberations to ease the tax burden have gathered pace as authorities try to curb the rupee's depreciation," a report said, quoting unidentified sources.

Despite the West Asia war, India's exports grew 13.6% year-on-year in April. Concerns on rising import bill persists as

crude oil prices have doubled after the start of the war on February 28.

The immediate worry is the outflow of capital as Foreign Portfolio Investors (FPIs) continue to sell their equity holdings. According to estimates, FPIs have taken out ₹2.2 lakh crore since the war began. Though capital flows are outside the CAD calculation, they are used to finance the CAD.

Sell-offs by FPIs led to a steep fall in the value of the Indian rupee against the dollar. On February 28 the rupee was trading at ₹91.07. It has depreciated about 7% so far in 2026 and is down roughly 6.1% since the outbreak of the war. The depreciation would add massively to the import bill for fuel and fertilisers, stoking inflation. Already in April, the Wholesale Price Index (WPI) inflation touched 8.3% from just 3.88% in March and 2.26% in April last

year.

To check the trade deficit the government has increased the import duty on gold and silver to 15% from 6% and put other procedural restrictions on their imports. Prime Minister Narendra Modi appealed to citizens not to buy gold for a year, conserve fuel, cut edible oil use and postpone overseas travel — all of which require foreign exchange.

According to Ica, while the hike in customs duty on gold and silver may provide some respite, the merchandise deficit prints are expected to remain elevated in the near term, which is set to weigh on the CAD. Ica projects the CAD to widen to a little over 2% of GDP in Q1FY27, following the expected seasonal narrowing in Q4 FY26. For FY27, assuming an average crude oil price of \$95/bbl, the agency expects the CAD print at ~2% of GDP, more than double that estimated for FY26.

'West Asian disruption impact ...

What kind of support would airlines seek from the government during such difficult periods?

I genuinely believe the government has done an impressive job in aviation over the past several years. Whether it is ATF pricing, VAT reductions in cities like Mumbai and Delhi, or steps around airport charges such as Navi Mumbai's UDF, the pace of decision-making has been commendable. India today has a professional regulator and a ministry that actively cares about the sector. Sometimes we do not give enough credit to how quickly aviation-related issues are being addressed here.

How do you see the outlook for the Indian aviation market amid geopolitical uncertainty?

Akasa remains extremely bullish on the long-term future of aviation in India. Every year there are ups and downs in the industry, but aviation has

always gone through cycles.

Which domestic markets are driving growth?

Growth is visible across India. Over the last six months we added destinations such as Darbhanga and Dibrugarh, while Navi Mumbai has also opened up. We have additionally announced operations from Noida International Airport.

Can you share details on Haj operations?

Haj operations are allocated through a government tender process. This year, Akasa is operating 156 Haj flights from Srinagar, Mumbai, Nagpur, Indore, Ahmedabad, Bengaluru and Kozhikode.

What is Akasa's strategy around maintenance and MRO?

Routine line maintenance activities are handled internally to some extent, while larger

checks such as C-checks are done with partners like GMR in Hyderabad. Engine maintenance is handled with partners including CFM and ST Engineering. We have also signed an agreement with Noida International Airport for our first hangar facility, expected around 2028, which will enhance maintenance capabilities further.

What is Akasa's view on long-haul operations and widebody aircraft?

We ask ourselves that question every year and, for the last five years, the answer has remained the same, long-haul widebody operations are not for us. Our network is still relatively small, and introducing aircraft types for just a few routes adds complexity in maintenance, crew training and operations. Our view remains that widebody operations are not for Akasa.

Will Akasa continue focusing on Boeing 737 MAX aircraft?

Yes. Our overall order book of 226 aircraft also includes the larger Boeing 737 MAX 10 aircraft, although those are still some time away because certification is pending. The MAX 10 will offer slightly more capacity, closer to the Airbus A321 category.

Did the revised Flight Duty Time Limitation (FDTL) norms impact Akasa?

Like all airlines, we were economically impacted because cockpit crew utilisation changes under the revised norms. However, we had already been preparing for this for nearly two years. Did it disrupt passengers? No. We managed the transition through planning without operational disruptions. The economics affect all airlines similarly, but proper planning helps manage the impact smoothly.

Modi holds marathon meet as govt nears 12 years in office

HE IS ALSO understood to have flagged coordination and delivery-related issues requiring closer monitoring at the ministerial level.

Officials said the Department of Economic Affairs presented an assessment of the overall economic situation, ease of doing business measures and the need for ministries to review sectoral policies to make them more

investor-friendly. Key economic and infrastructure ministries also shared presentations on reforms undertaken over the past years and outlined future policy initiatives.

Ministries are learnt to have submitted reports detailing major decisions implemented in recent years and the roadmap ahead. Sources said Modi shared his vision for the government's functioning in the

coming year, stressing citizen-centric policymaking and the broader objective of achieving "Viksit Bharat". Discussions also focused on governance reforms, legislative measures and policing reforms as the government enters the next phase of its third term.

The meeting took place against the backdrop of rising global concerns over energy security and increasing fuel

prices linked to tensions in West Asia and disruptions around the Strait of Hormuz, a crucial maritime trade route.

Modi had recently urged citizens to contribute towards economic resilience by reducing dependence on imported fuel and adopting sustainable alternatives. He called for greater use of public transport, carpools, railways for goods movement and electric vehicles.
