Burt Bacharach, legendary composer, dies

LOS ANGELES: Burt Bacharach, the singularly gifted and popular composer and Oscar winner who delighted millions with the quirky arrangements and unforgettable melodies of "Walk on By," "Do You Know the Way to San Jose" and dozens of other hits, has died at 94. Bacharach died on Wednesday at home in Los Angeles of natural causes, publisher Tina Brusam said Thursday. He had a run of top 10 hits and his music was heard everywhere from movie soundtracks and radios to home stereo systems and iPods, whether "Alfie" and "I Say a Little Prayer" or "I'll Never Fall in Love Again" and "This Guy's in Love with You."

Proposed mine blocked in Aus

CANBERRA: Australia's Environment Minister Tanya Plibersek on Thursday blocked a proposed coal mine to protect the Great Barrier Reef. Plibersek had recently announced she has rejected plans for the Central Queensland Coal Project because of the risks it posed to the iconic reef, freshwater creeks and groundwater. She proposed blocking the site in August 2022 and launched a public consultation process, receiving more than 9,000 submissions -- about 98 per cent of which were in favour of rejecting the project.

Walmart shooter pleads guilty

HOUSTON: The gunman who killed 23 people in 2019 at a Walmart in the Texas border city of El Paso has pleaded guilty to 90 charges, including 23 counts of hate crimes resulting in death. His plea on Wednesday came three years, six months and five days after the mass shooting took place on August 3, 2019 as the deadliest attack targeting Hispanics in American history. Patrick Crusius, then 21 years old, also admitted guilty to 23 counts of use of a firearm to commit murder in a crime of violence, 22 counts of hate crime in an attempt to kill, and 22 counts of use of a firearm during a crime of violence.

4 die after storm hits Rio de Janeiro

RIO DE JANEIRO: At least four people, including a two-year-old girl, were killed after a severe storm triggered flooding and landslides in the Brazil's Rio de Janeiro city, authorities said. According to local disaster reduction authorities, the storm dumped an estimated 70 per cent of February's rainfall in one night, reports Xinhua news agency. The city's mayor Eduardo Paes called on residents to stay put and avoid inundated areas. The fire department said it had rescued more than 70 people trapped by flooding in Rio and the metropolitan area.

Singapore to scrap travel curbs

SINGAPORE: Singapore will scrap all Covid border safety measures from next Monday when the country steps down its disease alert to its lowest level. Singapore will also step down its disease alert to its lowest level since the Covid pandemic started three years ago, with face masks no longer mandatory on local public transport as well as at some healthcare and residential care settings from Monday. Once the border measures are scrapped, all travellers, including those who are not vaccinated, will not have to show proof of a negative pre-departure test before entering Singapore.

Murugan arrives in Jaffna

COLOMBO: Union Minister of State for Information and Broadcasting L Murugan on Thursday visited the Kankesanthurai port in northern Sri Lanka as part of India's focus on connectivity and infrastructure development. Murugan, who arrived in Jaffna earlier in the day on a four-day visit to Sri Lanka, also met with Governor Jeevan Thiyagarajah and underlined the importance India attaches to Jaffna and the region in development partnership, the Indian mission said.

Survivors battle hunger, cold

Plight of homeless deepens as Turkey-Syria earthquake toll crosses 20,000

Thousands of people who lost their homes in a catastrophic earthquake huddled around campfires and clamoured for food and water in the bitter cold, three days after the temblor and series of aftershocks hit Turkey and Syria, killing more than 20,000.

Rescuers continued their race to pull more people alive from the rubble with the window closing to find trapped survivors. While stories of miraculous rescues briefly buoyed spirits, the grim reality of the hardship facing tens of thousands who survived the disaster cast a pall.

In the Turkish city of Antakya, dozens of people scrambled for aid in front of a truck distributing children's coats and other supplies.

Ahmet Tokgoz, a survivor, called for the government to evacuate people from the devastated region. While many of the tens of thousands who have lost their homes have found shelter in tents, stadiums and other temporary ac-

GEORGIAN RESCUE DOG SAVES SURVIVOR

A Georgian rescue dog on Thursday saved a survivor of Turkey's devastating earthquake during ongoing efforts in the aftermath of the disaster, the spokesperson of Georgia's Emergency Management Service said.

Giorgi Tukhareli said the three-year-old dog, named Tinto, had found a survivor in the mass of rubble remaining after the 7.8 magnitude earthquake that left over 20,000 dead.

He added the search and rescue crew member had been trained in the work and notified rescuers of his discoveries of survivors



under the rubble by barking to alert them. The spokesperson said the dog had also performed the role "perfectly" in a number of circumstances back in

Georgia. The dog's successful effort has brought the figure of the victims saved by Georgian professionals to three over the past several days.

Quake hits Indonesia killing 4

A shallow earthquake shook Indonesia's easternmost province of Papua on Thursday, killing four people who were unable to escape when a floating restaurant collapsed into the sea.

The US Geological Survey said the magnitude 5.1 earthquake hit residential areas in Jayapura, near Papua's northern coast and was centered at a

depth of 22 kilometres (13 miles). Shallow quakes often cause more damage on the Earth's surface.

"The residents were really panicked. I was in a car, and I felt like the car's wheels were lifted up," said Tri Asih, a resident of Jayapura, Papua's capital.

Officials said four people who were inside a floating restaurant died when the quake caused it to collapse into the

sea. "The bodies of the four victims have been recovered," National Disaster Mitigation Agency spokesperson Abdul Muhari said at a news conference. "The victims were trapped under the rubble of the cafe and covered by the roof."

Rescue divers were searching the area around the cafeteria for possible survivors.

US mulls action against entities linked to balloon

The US will explore taking action against the Chinese entities linked to its military that supported the surveillance balloon's incursion into American airspace, officials here said on Thursday.

The huge balloon was shot down by a US fighter jet on Saturday off the coast of South Carolina in the Atlantic Ocean.

"We know the PRC (People's Republic of China) has overflowed these surveillance balloons over more than 40 countries across 5 continents. The Biden Administration is reaching out to countries



directly about the scope of this programme and answer any questions," a senior State Department official said.

Speaking on condition of anonymity, the official asserted that it is known that China used these balloons for surveillance.

"High resolution imagery from U-2 flybys revealed that the high-altitude balloon was capable of conducting signals in-

telligence collection operations. The high altitude balloons' equipment was clearly for intelligence surveillance and inconsistent with the equipment on-board weather balloons," the official alleged.

"It had multiple antennas to include an array likely capable of collecting and geo-locating communications. It was equipped with solar panels large enough to produce the requisite power to operate multiple active intelligence collection sensors," the official said, days after the Chinese Surveillance balloon was shot down by fighter jets in the Atlantic Ocean.

EU calls out Twitter for patchy disinformation report

Twitter failed to provide a full report to the EU on its efforts to combat online disinformation, drawing a rebuke on Thursday from top officials of the 27-nation bloc.

The company signed up to the EU's voluntary 2022 Code of Practice on Disinformation last year - before billionaire Tesla CEO Elon Musk bought the social media platform.

Under the code, online platforms including Google, TikTok, Facebook and Instagram parent Meta agreed to commit to measures aimed at reducing disinformation. They filed their first "baseline" reports last month showing how they're living up to their promises.



All who signed up to the voluntary code, which also includes ad-tech companies and civil society groups, submitted complete reports - except Twitter.

"I am disappointed to see that Twitter report lags behind others and I expect a more serious commitment to their obligations stemming from the Code," Vera Jourova, the European Commission's executive vice president for values and transparency, said in a statement.

US to reduce visa backlog in India

The US State Department has implemented recommendations of a presidential commission, which has suggested steps like opening up American diplomatic missions outside India for visa appointments to reduce the visa backlog in the country.

Nicaragua frees 222 political opponents

As many as 222 inmates, who are considered by many to be political prisoners of the government of Nicaraguan President Daniel Ortega, were on their way to Washington on Thursday, a senior

Biden administration official confirmed.

"The government of Nicaragua decided unilaterally to release 222 individuals whom they had imprisoned," said the official, who agreed to speak on condition of anonymity.

"Some of these individuals have spent years in prison, many of them for exercising their fundamental freedoms, in awful conditions and with no access to due process," according to the official.

Ortega has maintained that his imprisoned opponents and others were behind 2018 street protests that he claims were a plot to overthrow him.

Tens of thousands have fled into exile since Nicaraguan security forces violently put down those

anti-government protests.

Biden seems to slip on oil comments

President Joe Biden sparked a firestorm in energy circles when he said in Tuesday's State of the Union address that the United States will need oil "for at least another decade".

Republicans in the House chamber laughed at Biden's off-the-cuff remark, which was not in his scripted speech. GOP lawmakers accused the Democratic president of refusing to accept reality and "living in a green hallucination," as Montana Sen. Steve Daines put it.

"President Biden implied tonight America would not produce oil beyond the next decade. If you believe that, you have missed a lot and live in a dream world. God help America," Sen Lindsey Graham, R-S.C., said in a tweet.
