### No sign of baby kidnapped from Sola Civil; probe handed over to Crime Branch

AHMEDABAD: With no sign of the newborn girl kidnapped from Sola Civil Hospital less than 48 hours after her birth, the case has been handed over to the Ahmedabad Crime Branch. CCTV footage showed that the infant had been lifted by an unidentified woman.

Sola police tried to look for the kidnapper on the basis of CCTV footage, but without any success.

In the case details, Saraswati Rajendra Pasi was admitted to the maternity ward of Sola Civil Hospital. The family hails from Amethi in Uttar Pradesh and lives in Rajivnagar in Ambawadi. Saraswati gave birth to a girl on Tuesday, August 31.

The girl was kept in the post-natal care ward of Sola Civil on the third floor. CCTV footage showed that at 3 am on Thursday, a woman with her face covered left with the baby.

Sola police had registered a case of kidnapping and initiated investigation. However, so far they have not been able to get any clues about the whereabouts of the woman or the baby.

After taking over the investigation, the Crime Branch formed teams of 70 personnel to look for the baby. The woman who kidnapped the baby is believed to be middle-aged. Police are now trying to get CCTV footage from places near the hospital to trace the movement of the woman after she left the hospital.

### Covid-19: Gujarat report 15 new cases in 24 hours

AHMEDABAD: While Gujarat government has assumed a strict posture against acid attack and come out with a compensation scheme for victims, an acid attack victim has been waiting for justice four years after filing a petition in the Gujarat high court. The government is still undecided on extending financial assistance to her.

The 29-year-old woman is now seeking medical aid for surgery that she needs to undergo in a private hospital for her damaged oesophagus because she was forced to consume acid allegedly by her husband and in-laws on August 13, 2012 in Alvar in Rajasthan. Her parents, who live in Gujarat, brought her to Ahmedabad and she was given treatment at the Civil Hospital.

In 2017, she moved the high court seeking Rs 5 lakh financial assistance from the state government under the Central Victim Compensation Fund, and compensation of Rs 1 lakh under the Prime Minister National Relief Fund (PMNRF).

In January, the Centre rejected her demand for compensation under the PMNRF by saying that she fell victim to the acid attack in 2012, and the provision extending financial assistance for acid attack victims was introduced only in 2016.

While the victim has little hope from PMNRF, the state government is still unsure about whether to compensate her. The Rs 3.9 crore fund that the state government had received for the year 2017-18 according to the Central Victim Compensation Fund Guidelines, Rs 3.08 crore was utilized and the remaining amount was surrendered back to Gujarat by the Centre.

According to the victim's advocate N M Kapadia, while the state government did not commit itself to extend any financial assistance to her, it has lately raised another contention that the incident had taken place in Rajasthan and not in Gujarat.

Since there was no clarity on providing financial assistance to the victim, the high court on Friday said that if the governments does not take any decision on the victim's claim, the court would have to adjudicate the problem. Advocate Kapadia said that as the victim's oesophagus was badly damaged, she has not been able to eat food with her mouth since the incident took place. She required plastic surgery, but the doctors at the Civil Hospital expressed their inability to deal with the case.

### Primary school teachers to work 2 hours more daily

AHMEDABAD: The state education department seems to have woken up from its slumber after a gap of 11 years to increase the daily working hours for teachers by two hours. It has cited a rule in the Right to Education (RTE) Act, 2009 for this decision. However, teachers' associations have opposed this decision, claiming that the government is trying to settle a score with teachers for not attending the recent 'assessment survey'.

In a notification issued by the department recently, the daily working hours for primary school teachers have been increased by two hours to eight hours from Monday to Friday. On Saturdays, they will work for five hours, which is the current scenario. From 35 hours a week, the working hours have been increased to 45 hours, according to the notification dated August 26.

Ghanshyam Patel, president of Rashtriya Shaikshik Mahasangha Gujarat, said the government was holding a grudge against the teachers who did not participate in the August 24 survey that was carried out to evaluate the preparedness of primary teachers in imparting quality education. The decision is likely to impact 2 lakh teachers in the state.

"We have made a representation to the state government in this regard and plan to launch a protest if the government does not roll back its decision," said Patel.

The state government faced a major setback recently as only 37% of primary teachers participated in the survey. The association went on to plan to launch a protest if the government does not roll back its decision," said Patel.

### One-child norm: Ramdas Athwale to take up issue with PM

AHMEDABAD: Union minister of state for social justice and empowerment and Republican Party of India (RPI) (Athwale group) supremo Ramdas Athwale on Saturday said his party supports one-child policy as an effective way of population control to ensure development." Athwale was addressing a press conference at the government circuit house at Shahibaug in Ahmedabad. He added, "As a central minister, I will take up the issue of a one-child policy with Prime Minister Narendra Modi soon."

He reiterated that there was no question of inclusion of the Patidar community of Gujarat, Marathas of Maharashtra, Jats of UP and Kshatriyas of Rajasthan on the OBC list.

"The Mandal commission is clear on the communities that are presently categorized as an OBC. There can be no additions. Instead, a new category for economically backward communities (EBC), where members of all castes in the general category who have an annual income less than Rs 8 lakh can be given reservations." On his opinion about Gujarat deputy Chief Minister Nitin Patel's remark a week ago, that people will only be allowed to discuss the Constitution and secularism as long as Hindus are in the majority, Athwale said there was, "no chance of the Hindu population shrinking," adding "one does not see a scenario where the Muslim population is rising sharply in all these years." ### Gujarat: Gurus' leap of imagination bridged the tech gap in pandemic

AHMEDABAD: Raghav Katakia, a teacher from Rajiv Gandhi Centre for Education Innovation (RMCEI) at IIM Ahmedabad (IIM-A), is part of the 800-odd teachers whose initiatives during the Covid-19 pandemic are documented as part of the innovation bank. As Sunday would mark Teachers' Day for the state schools it's the day to celebrate many teachers who went out of their way to beg, borrow and innovate during the pandemic. These Gujarat teachers ensured education reached students in rural areas, who unlike their urban counterparts, did not have access to TV screens or mobile phones. Like Katakia, Deepak Moti in Mandvi, Kutch, developed an e-bicycle powered by solar cells to take online classes to most economically backward villages. The Rs 18,000 bike provides backdrop to his open classroom with laptop and speakers. Prof Vijaya Shery Chand, chairperson of RMCEI, said that the pandemic exposed the existing digital divide in the society.

Teachers were quick to realize it. Their primary worry was that the students would forget the teachings, and would be devoid of formal education for a long period. Thus, they started innovating and reaching out to them," he said. He added that the teachers from across Gujarat had networked heavily with like-minded teachers to learn the ropes of new technology and educational innovations.

"Covid-19 has raised acceptance of informal schools across the country. The e-bicycle ensures children in remote areas are not deprived of education," says Moti of his innovation which has been replicated by other school teachers in Gujarat and Maharashtra. In Mehsana, Ravi Patel of Cluster Resource Centre in Suraj village in Jotana taluka raised funds to install 75 television sets with DTH connections across 10 villages of the area. In Patan, a desperate parent and an equally desperate principal joined hands to reach education to students using the cable TV network to help solve their problems faced studying through mobile phones. After his daughter complained of difficulties in studying on phone, Mayur Goswami, a cable TV operator in Sankeshwar town met Ashok Dave, the principal of DP Prajapati School. Joint education started bearing on people's homes. Instead of classroom sessions from a big hall with multiple cameras in action. The editing was done in a local studio and each session was telecast using the cable TV network.

### Turnout low for Classes 6 to 8 on Day 1 in Gujarat

AHMEDABAD: Schools in Gujarat saw thin participation from Class 6 to Class 8 primary level students for whom campus studies resumed from September 2, amid looming fear of a possible third wave of coronavirus.

For private schools, only 12.26% of the total student strength attended school on the first day, according to data compiled by the state government. Out of 10,86,871 students in private schools, 1,33,302 students of Class 6 to Class 8 attended school on Thursday.

In Ahmedabad, 2,361 students of 21,033 or 11.23% attended school. According to the school reopening guidelines only 50% of students are allowed to attend, hence the attendance was about 24% on September 2. Surendranagar saw the highest attendance of 32.24% while Botad saw the lowest at 5.17%.

The state government has cited a considerable drop in coronavirus cases in the state to justify their decision to reopen schools in a staggered manner with strict Covid protocols and guidelines. For government schools, of 19,83,652 students about 34% or 6,77,111 students attended school. The attendance was as high as 68% when the 50% student capacity guidelines, the government claimed in its data analysis. In Ahmedabad the attendance was 29.71% with 17,469 students attending out of the total strength of 58,803. Navsari district saw the highest participation with 54.85% while Porbandar district had the lowest participation with 15.92% attendance.

Despite the 50% limit in attendance, districts like Navsari and Aravalli (52.57%) saw more than half of the total student strength attending schools on the first day.

### Two cops suspended for thrashing man

RAJKOT: Junagadh superintendent of police (SP) Vasamsetty Ravi Tej suspended two constable of Batva police station following a video that went viral in which the cops are seen beating a man named Kana Keshava.

According to police, constables Rajiv Bandhiya and Chetan Majivder were suspended after the victim registered a private complaint with the local court. Keshava, who serves in the army, was sent for a medical test by the court.

Keshava and some others were for obstructing a government officer in discharging duty on the night of August 28. According to police, an old woman approached Batva police station at around 10pm expressing fear of attack from her son-in-law and his cousins including Keshava. On August 29, a woman police inspector went there with the two constables where two three people allegedly behaved rudely and a mob gathered as heated argument ensued. They allegedly attacked police and ransacked their vehicle.

The woman constable had to hide herself in a house till the police back-up arrived in the village, police said.

### Five ransack coal trader's office to recover borrowed money

RAJKOT: Five persons were booked for ransacking a businessman's office in Gandhidam town of Kutch on Wednesday evening allegedly to recover debt.

According to police, Bharat Shah (55), who is engaged in coal trading, lodged a complaint against Darshak Dholakia and his four aides for ransacking his son's office and issuing a threat to him for recovery of borrowed money. The office boy informed Shah about the attack, who immediately called up Gadwhi. But Gadwhi threatened Shah and told him to pay Rs 1.75 crore or face the consequences, said police. Shah's police complaint stated that a few months ago, he had borrowed Rs 35 lakh from an Dshant Gadwhi and later had repaid Rs 15 lakh.

The complaint further stated that Gadwhi had asked Dholakia to recover Rs 15 lakh from Shah. "On Wednesday, Dholakia and his men entered the office of Shah's son in Gandhidam and ransacked it. They stole CCTV, hard-disk and other items from the office," the police said.

The office boy informed Shah about the attack, who immediately called up Gadwhi. But Gadwhi threatened Shah and told him to pay Rs 1.75 crore or face the consequences, said police.

### Fiance gets life term for killing constable

AHMEDABAD: A sessions court here sentenced the fiance of a police constable to life imprisonment for killing her in February 2018. The convict did not want to marry her because he suspected that she was having an affair with another man. The court also fined Himanshu Chauhan Rs 1 lakh, 90% of which will be awarded as compensation to the mother of the late cop Hema Rathod. She was posted as Lok Rakshak constable at Savli police station. As per the case details, 25-year-old Rathod's burnt body was found from a farm at Moti Bhadol village in Savli taluka on February 16 in 2018. Police arrested Chauhan as he was seen with Rathod in the footage of CCTV cameras installed at two different locations. During the interrogation Chauhan admitted that he had killed Rathod as he suspected that she was having an affair with some other man and was avoiding him. He had also told cops that he wanted to call off the engagement but did not want to tell his family members because they all liked Rathod. So, to avoid the wedding, he planned to kill her. A day before the body was found, Chauhan took her to the farm where he confronted her about the suspected affair which led to a heated argument.
