INDIA AI IMPACT SUMMIT

Global, Indian firms to work on AI adoption

New Delhi, 19 February

Leading global artificial intelligence (AI) companies that develop frontier AI models and Indian firms such as Sarvarm, BharatGen, Gnani and Soket, have voluntarily committed to working together to enhance analysis on global AI adoption for economic purposes, Union Electronics and Information Technology Minister Ashwini Vaishnaw said on Thursday.

These voluntary commitments reflect a shared vision for "inclusive and responsible AI", he said.

Among the commitments made by the companies is the undertaking to publish by the next AI Summit statistical insights derived from anonymised, aggregated, and taxonomised usage data, either directly or through contributions to international efforts, Vaishnaw said.

Apart from this, these companies will also work together to strengthen multilingual use-case evaluations, he said.

"Participating organisations recognise that cross-lingual support is helpful for democratising AI and aspire to improve AI performance and high-quality experiences for users across the globe," the text of the voluntary declaration signed on Thursday stated.

Further, all signatories will recognise the value of partnerships with governments and local ecosystems that have or may develop datasets and expertise, and will evaluate multilingual capabilities across a subset of languages and cultural con-

texts while preserving flexibility in the choice of tools, benchmarks, and AI systems prioritised for this work.

The voluntary signatories will also collaborate with local ecosystems to develop and apply evaluations for underrepresented languages and cultural contexts.

"Together, these efforts mark an important step towards shaping AI that is not only powerful, but also inclusive, development-oriented, and globally relevant. This initiative positions India at the forefront of building a Global South-led perspective on AI governance," Vaishnaw said, adding that this perspective balances innovation, equity, and real-world impact.

'Countries must focus on AI stack that's needed'

Q&A A country's sovereign Artificial Intelligence (AI) Mission should focus on the part of AI stack that is needed the most, says **Vivek Mohindra**, special adviser to Dell's Vice Chairman and Chief Operating Officer Jeff Clarke. In a conversation with Avik Das, Mohindra, who also works with Michael Dell, talks about the company's AI strategy and what it takes to be an AI-ready organisation. Edited excerpts:

How do you view the Indian government's take on sovereign AI?

■ I think the term sovereign AI has different interpretations for different countries. The point I make around sovereign AI is that which part of the AI stack a country needs to own and control so that it controls its destiny in terms of what it's able to do. And number two, how the country is able to use that stack to fulfil its aspirations for its citizens and its ambitions. So, if you look at sovereign AI from that perspective, I think all countries are approaching it slightly differently.

Therefore, for countries in Africa, their anchor points around sovereign AI has to do with not only data models, but also thinking about infrastructure from a very different perspective, because many of them do not have, nor do they need, to the tune of \$50 billion per gigawatt (Gw) to set up a training cluster. What they do need is smaller-scale infrastructure clusters

coupled with PCs to be able to allow their citizens to take advantage of that.

I think the Indian approach to sovereign AI is the right approach, which is you cannot go from zero to 100 per cent sovereignty across the whole stack. It has to be done in phases. And the way India is approaching it right now is the right, measured approach towards sovereign AI.

From a Dell perspective, so far we have taken the approach of whatever is the right, appropriate interpretation of sovereign AI for any given country.

What sort of engagements do you have with the Indian government when it comes to building sovereign AI?

■ At Dell, we don't operate at the model layer from a software

perspective, but we provide the infrastructure for that. For us, it is what is required to fully unleash the power of AI, which revolves around providing an affordable edge. This edge is really not these big data centres in the central, but pushing AI to the edges, providing turnkey AI factories, because that's what a lot of MSMEs need.

Since you advise Michael Dell and Jeff Clarke, can you outline some of the key pillars in Dell's AI strategy?

■ First, we decided that our AI strategy has to be in support of our business strategy. Second, we took that AI and deconstructed it so we could help inform our strategies appropriately. And the way we just deconstructed that was in four simple things — AI in, on, for, and with. We thought about

how we embed AI in our products so they just run much better. We thought about what our road maps across servers, storage, networking, PCs need to be so our customers can run their workloads much better on our products, that's AI on. AI with was who to partner with to bring these capabilities to our customers. And AI for was how we take AI and apply it for ourselves to transform ourselves. And the next thing we did is we developed a set of guiding principles around AI.

You have a career that spans tech enterprises, consultancies as well as private equity. As you steer an organisation to being an AI-led one, what are the challenges?

■ From a strategic perspective, the real question is how do you come up with a strategy that takes advantage of that pace of change and adapt the internal operations to be able to deliver on that pace of change. Then, how do you think about the risk-reward tradeoff within those?

Frequently, it comes down to not only figuring out what are the use cases you focus on and getting the whole company focused on those, but also doing things like getting the data in shape as well.



AI biggest opportunity for tech, IT: Tata Sons Chair

Highlighting that artificial intelligence (AI) is the "next big infrastructure, an infrastructure of intelligence", Tata Sons Chairman N Chandrasekaran said that it would have a very profound impact just like steam engines, electricity or the internet had in the past.

Underlining the transformative impact of AI, Chandrasekaran said that the group is adopting AI across the stack.

Announcing major plans for the company, Chandrasekaran said the Tata group would establish the country's first large-scale AI optimised data centre, purpose-built for next-generation AI training and inference. "I'm very happy to announce that we have partnered with OpenAI to build the first 100 megawatt capacity, which will scale to 1 gigawatt."

Mentioning the need for global and local partnerships, he added that the company also announced a collaboration with AMD

to create high-density AI capacity in India.

As for other initiatives, he said, "We are already building an AI data insights platform. What we are building is totally based on diverse Indian data sets on top of the foundational models. So, intelligence becomes available across the diversity of Indian contexts."

Chandrasekaran mentioned that TCS and Tata Communications together are building an AI operating system for the industries. "What we will do is build agentic industry solutions for every industry. We are already well on that journey and will work with partners to be able to launch it and take it to all enterprises around the globe." In addition, the firm also has plans to build domain-centric AI-optimised chips for every industry. "We will first launch or work towards getting it ready for the automotive sector," he added.

For the IT sector, he said this is the biggest opportunity for the industry. "Because the IT industry's real value is the context: An understanding of every enterprise's business and



technology landscape and make the right technology work inside the processes and the ecosystem, the supplier, customer and all the other connections an enterprise has," he added. He said, "I just want to say that we are standing here at a very defining moment. It is the age of abundant intelligence, where the scarce resources are trust, stewardship, and human capability."

We thank God there is AI: Chandra

Artificial intelligence (AI) has the ability to change society to unimaginable levels, empower people and help reinvent businesses, even though the pace of changes may vary, Tata Sons Chairman N Chandrasekaran said during a fireside chat with Sam Altman at the AI Impact Summit. "We thank God there is AI," he said, adding, "The job at hand for us is to get everyone excited and get everyone ready for AI, irrespective of whether they are blue collar or white collar worker." He said the government needs to use AI to fix the poor infrastructure in Indian cities, try to remove inequality and address chronic health-care problems.
